NEW ZEALAND – DUBAI

two nights + early check-in Dubai Days 1-2 We depart New Zealand bound for Dubai and a two-night stop before continuing to Cairo and the start of our exciting journey of discovery of Egypt and Jordan.

EGYPT & JORDAN

Day 3 This morning we have a city tour of old and modern Dubai. Marvel at the Burj Khalifa, the world's tallest building, and browse the unique goods at **Souk Madinat**. Rest up before we explore the beauty of the sand dunes on an exciting safari adventure late afternoon, driving over mountainous sand dunes and dining Bedouin style in a camp setting in the desert, entertained by belly dancers and traditional Arabic musicians.

DUBAI – CAIRO

three nights Cairo

Day 3 We arrive in Cairo this afternoon and with time to freshen up we'll enjoy a brief orientation tour of the city.

Day 4 We're on our way to Giza to see the Great Pyramids, Sphinx and the Solar Boat discovered in 1954, believed to be the funeral boat of King Khufu, though controversy remains. We'll also visit Memphis and Sakkara, which played important parts in the formative years of Egypt's history.

Day 5 Today we've allowed plenty of time to explore the Egyptian Museum, housing thousands of treasures within. Following this we'll up the tempo as we head to an exciting market known as Khan el-Khalili bazaar. There'll be plenty of time to have some lunch, then test your bargaining skills against the friendly and charismatic stall keepers.

CAIRO – LUXOR

Day 6 A morning at leisure before our afternoon transfer to the airport for our flight to Luxor, a city of approximately 150,000 people and often referred to as the world's greatest open-air museum. Whilst in Luxor our sightseeing will include a visit to the extraordinary **Temple of Karnak.**

LUXOR - ESNA - EDFU - KOM OMBO - ASWAN

four night Nile Cruise There's a buzz in the air today, as we board our **5-star Nile cruise** vessel and get settled in for the following four nights cruising the mighty Nile River. Taking inspiration from the colonial era, our ship is elegantly designed with wood finishes and cosy public spaces. Soak in the warm weather on the Sun Deck which has shaded cabanas and a swimming pool. There is an elegant library, stylish lounge, a full service bar and dining area where you'll discover the regional cuisine.

Days 7-11 Cruising the Nile. Highlights during the cruise will include the Valley of Kings and the Temple of Queen Hatshepsut and Memnon Colossi in Luxor. Crossing the locks between Esna and Edfu, the Temple of Edfu, sailing on to Kom Ombo and visiting the Temple of Kom Ombo. We then sail on to Aswan where we'll visit the formidable High Dam, Temple of Philae, and the unfinished obelisk, and in the afternoon, we'll sail by felucca around the Botanical Gardens.

ASWAN – ABU SIMBEL

Day 11 Arriving in Aswan we disembark our cruise boat and take a short flight to Abu Simbel, where we'll be seeing the incredible Temples of Pharaoh Ramesses II and his Queen Nefertari, which share an amazing history as well as a fascinating story of removal and relocation to their current position when threatened with being lost under water in Lake Nasser when the high dam was constructed. This evening we'll be treated to a spectacular 'sound and light' show'.

ABU SIMBEL – ASWAN - CAIRO

Day 12 Today we fly back to Cairo with a brief stop in Aswan, where we'll make our way to the Nubian Museum tracing the history of the Nubian region, defined as the area between Aswan in Egypt and Khartoum in Sudan.

CAIRO - AMMAN - DEAD SEA

Day 13 This morning we fly from Cairo to Amman and travel to the Dead Sea with a stop enroute at Bethany. Significant in Biblical terms, it was the place where the disciple John lived and performed baptisms, including that of Jesus himself, on the banks of the Jordan River. Resting at 396m below sea level, the Dead Sea is the lowest point on earth and over 3 million years old! With a salt content of 33% compared to the average sea salt content of 3% it's not hard to see why it has the highest salinity of all the seas water. It is also entirely devoid of life.

Day 14 Today is all about you! Do as much or as little as you please. Our hotel has several magnificent pools and is located just a short hop from the beautiful beach, a stroll along which will take you to the shops, restaurants, and entertainment area of the main township. We'll also be on hand to assist you with any optional tour you wish to do.

DEAD SEA – WADI RUM

Day 15 Leaving by coach today we make our way south and into the desert, for an unforgettable adventure. Experience the magic of the desert with a stay at a Wadi Rum Desert Camp. Nestled amidst the breath-taking red sand dunes, these camps offer a unique opportunity to connect with nature and immerse yourself in the tranquillity of the Jordanian desert.

Day 16 We'll explore more of this rugged landscape today using off-road vehicles. Marvel at the stunning rock formations, and vast expanse of desert. As night falls, from the comfort of our cosy Bedouin-style camp site we'll enjoy traditional Arabic hospitality, and gaze upon the star-speckled sky, as you may never have seen it. A truly unforgettable Arabian adventure.

WADI RUM – PETRA

one night Petra Day 17 Get ready to be amazed! All but lost to the modern world until 1812, Petra is a real archaeological gem, full of ancient tombs and ruins ripe for the modern-day discoverer. We take a golf buggy ride through the narrow canyon or 'siq' to the spectacular main entrance to the city. We'll see amazing sights such as the Street of Facades, the Theatre, Colonnaded Street and Qasr al Bint, not to mention one of the world's most admired antiquities, Al Khazneh (The Treasury) water channels, and staircases.

PETRA – AMMAN

two nights Amman

Day 18 The drive from Petra to Amman takes us through the diverse landscapes of Jordan. We initially pass through stunning desert terrain, characterized by vast stretches of sand and rocky outcrops. The route gradually transitions into more mountainous areas, offering breath-taking views of towering cliffs and deep valleys, with the journey culminating in the bustling capital city.

Day 19 Amman is the capital of the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan; it is also known as the ancient city of Philadelphia. A city that has an interesting mix of ancient and modern. Ammonites, Greeks, Romans, Byzantines and Muslims left their footprints layer upon layer in and around the city. From the top of the Citadel, one of the highest hills in Amman, you have a splendid view of the old city. We'll visit the Citadel with the Archeological Museum and the Roman Theater. We'll also see Jordan's 'desert castles', their fine mosaics, frescoes, stone and stucco carvings and illustrations, tell countless stories of life as it was during the 8th century.

AMMAN - JERASH - DUBAI

One night Dubai


Day 20 This morning we travel to Jerash, less than one hour from Amman, driving through the picturesque hills of ancient Gilead. Famous for Hadrian's Triumphal Arch, the Hippodrome, the great elliptical forum, theatres, baths and gateways, the Roman bridge, and the wide street of columns that lead to the Temple of Artemis. We'll witness a re-enactment of formidable fighting techniques employed by a Roman Legion once stationed here. On our return, we'll proceed to the airport to begin our flights homeward.

Days 21- 22 After a short stop in Dubai to rest our heads with a good night's sleep and to freshen up, we are transferred to the airport for the last time, and sadly our journey comes to an end as we arrive in New Zealand, heads filled with many wonderful memories of our time spent together in this ancient land.



NEW ZEALAND – DUBAI

two nights + early check-in Dubai

Days 1-2 We depart New Zealand today on Emirates bound directly for Dubai for a two-night stopover enroute to our magnificent destination of Istanbul, the only city in the world to span two continents, Asia, and Europe. Our stay in Dubai includes a city tour, a journey through Dubai's vibrant metropolis with its modern landmarks, the Burj Khalifa and Burj Al Arab. Experience the authentic spice and sounds of the Souks in the old city.

Day 3 Today you are free to shop, sightsee, relax, or just sleep in before our evening Desert Safari adventure where we discover the Arabian natural desert and enjoy a campsite dinner.

DUBAI – ISTANBUL

three nights Istanbul

one night Canakkale

Day 4 After an afternoon arrival in Istanbul we'll make our way to our hotel, where the remainder of the day is yours to relax and get settled in. Our hotel is perfectly positioned in Istanbul's historic Sultanahmet district close to many famous sites which are within minutes' walking distance.

Days 5 – 6 Over the next two days we'll show you some of the greatest highlights of this wonderful city, including the Blue Mosque, Topkapi Palace, the Hippodrome, Hagia Sophia, Cistern Basilica, Egyptian Spice Market, the Grand Bazaar and more. We'll also have the pleasure of an afternoon cruise on the Bosphorus.

ISTANBUL – CANAKKALE

Day 7 We start the day a little earlier as we have some ground to cover making our way southwest toward the Gallipoli Peninsula. Arriving around midday we begin our visit at ANZAC Cove, before continuing to Lone Pine Cemetery and of particular importance to New Zealanders, Chanuk Bair, where many of our soldiers from that ill-fated campaign are remembered. Learn about the tragic losses, along with the heroic and compassionate acts carried out by soldiers from both sides during the campaign. Late afternoon we cross the Dardanelle Strait by ferry to Canakkale (Cannon Castle) and our overnight stay.

CANAKKALE – TROY – IZMIR

Day 8 A short hop to start the day as we head firstly to Troy. Despite popular belief there is more to Troy than just the Trojan Horse. See the remnants of nine cities built one upon the other, the first dating back to the third millennium and really highlighting the importance of Troy's strategic location. The catalyst for the Trojan Wars (1180 BC) was again ignited over 3,000 years later at Gallipoli.

We continue to Pergamon via scenic farmlands and fig plantations where, time permitting, we will stop and give you the opportunity to purchase some of the wonderful produce. Pergamon is located on fertile plains, punctuated by steep hills and the seemingly inaccessible fortress better known as the Acropolis. Rich in archaeological sites and steeped in history, Pergamon and Izmir (Smyrna) are two of the Seven Churches in the New Testament Book of Revelations written by John the Apostle.

IZMIR - EPHESUS - PAMUKKALE (Cotton Castle)

Day 9 Today we visit two stunning sights. Travelling predominantly across fertile farmland we skirt the ancient city of Ephesus, the third church visited on this trip that is mentioned in the Book of Revelations. Our first stop is at the **House of the Virgin Mary**. It is believed St John brought Mary to **Ephesus** after the crucifixion, where she spent her remaining years. We continue to the archaeological sight of Ephesus itself, entering the city via ancient Agora. We walk the famous Marble Road, see the stunning Library of Celsus, Temple of Hadrian, Hercules Gate, and the magnificent Stadium. We'll stop for lunch in a quaint country restaurant before embarking on our next highlight of the day Aphrodisias, home to one of a few remaining Tetrapylon Gates in the world, a magnificent theatre, the Temple of Aphrodite and one of the bestpreserved examples of an early stadium you'll find. We continue to Pamukkale, to enjoy the wonderful facilities on offer at our thermal spa resort before dinner.

one night Izmir

two nights Pamukkale

GREECE, TURKEY & THE MED



Day 10 This morning we visit the ancient Hierapolis to see the famous white **travertine terraces** and pools. After bathing our feet in the soothing thermal springs there is ample time to visit the **Agora**, the magnificent **Theatre**, and the **Martyrium** of **St Philip**, one of the twelve apostles who died here in 87 AD. For those interested in old bones and ornate crypts, this afternoon you will be fascinated when we visit the elaborate **Necropolis** (ancient cemetery).

PAMUKKALE – ANTALYA

two nights Antalya

Day 11 As we cross the Taurus Mountains and pass pine forests today, we make our way to the sea and one of Turkey's most archaeologically significant cities, Antalya. Excavations near this area uncovered artefacts dating back as far as 1900 BC. It was also from Antalya that the Knights of St John set sail to Palestine during the **Crusades**.

Day 12 A day at leisure today. Explore more of the Old Town, relax by the pool for a while, or perhaps make your way down to the beautiful blue Mediterranean for a refreshing swim. Our hotel is perfectly positioned to make the most of this tremendous coastal location.

ANTALYA – KONYA

one night Konya

Day 13 We climb the Taurus Mountains again today and view some of the prettiest scenery in Turkey. Our destination is Konya, origin of the **Whirling Dervishes of Mevlana**, a religious sect formed in the 13th century by Jalāl al-Dīn Muḥammad Rūmī, a mystic, poet, and Sufi Muslim.

KONYA – CAPPADOCIA

two nights Cappadocia

Day 14 Today we travel across the Anatolian Plain following the route of the **old Silk Road**, destination **Cappadocia**. We see several **Caravanserai** along the route, an ancient hotel and haven for the camel caravans during their long journey. We'll also show you how silk is transformed from the raw material into beautiful carpets! Words cannot do justice to the region of Cappadocia, a landscape dotted with fairy-chimneys, **underground dwellings** and **monasteries** carved out of hillsides. Entire cities exist underground, some as deep as 12 floors down!

Day 15 For those who have elected to, we start the day early with an incredible flight over the sparse plains and fairy chimneys of the Urgup and Goreme region in our **Hot Air Balloon**. Following champagne to celebrate and a good breakfast we take you to explore the beautifully preserved **Tuff cave dwellings** and **churches** at the **Goreme Open Air Museum**, complete with colourful frescos depicting religious scenes from the Christian faith dating back as far as the 10th century AD.

CAPPADOCIA – ISTANBUL – ATHENS

one night Athens

Day 16 This morning we depart Cappadocia and bid farewell to Turkey, flying to Istanbul and on to Athens, where an overnight stay awaits before we join our Greek Island cruise.

Day 17 Athens today is at leisure until mid-afternoon when we transfer to Piraeus to join our Celestyal cruise ship . At 5pm, we depart Piraeus bound for Thessaloniki.

DAY 18 Thessaloniki (Greece) is a gorgeous and cosmopolitan seaside city and the largest in Greece after Athens. Centuries of cultural commingling has also made Thessaloniki a culinary nirvana, with almost too many great restaurants and little eateries to count.

Day 19 Kusadasi (Turkey) This former seaside village is now a popular Aegean resort town. The streets bustle with vendors of carpets, leather goods and books, and the customary ice-cream sellers. There's a shopping mall with sleek jewellery stores and European fashion boutiques. For the energetic, consider a walk along the peninsula to see the castle on Güvercinada (Pigeon Island).

Day 20 Crete (Heraklion) As we pull into Heraklion, you have the change to snap the imposing 16th Century walls of Koules Fortress. Here you can enjoy the calm of the stunning waterfront, explore the Cretan countryside, or discover the Palace of Knossos.

Days 21-22 Santorini (Greece) Cruising toward Santorini is something magical. Whitewashed houses and blue-domed churches perched atop lofty cliffs above the blue Aegean promises visitors adventure coupled with legendary tales. Strolling the gleaming white streets of Oia and her larger cousin Thira through a labyrinth of cafés, shops, taverna and galleries is to experience a living postcard. The changing vistas over the caldera from the clifftop is stunning, and everything we imagine of a Greek Island.

Days 22-23 Mykonos (Greece) A vibrant blend of art and culture and carefree Mediterranean lifestyle is an apt description of Mykonos. The town is easy to navigate, its cobbled whitewashed streets brimming with fabulous boutiques and galleries. The area of town referred to as Little Venice has the iconic windmills, and an abundance of quaint taverna, cafés and restaurants specialising in local fare. Beautiful beaches, ancient ruins and a photographer's paradise, Mykonos has it all.

Day 23 Milos is renowned for its stunningly clear blue waters, pristine beaches, and lacy coastline. It's a beach lover's dream with over 75 beaches in an area covering 160 square kms. By comparison Christchurch covers an area of 1400 square kms! It's R'n'R on Milos, and for the non-beach goers the seaside town of Adamas has plenty to keep one occupied.





two nights Athens


Day 24 Athens On arrival back in Athens we're met by our local guide.

Athens, the ancient centre of the arts, learning and philosophy, and regarded as the cradle of Western civilisation and democracy. There are also many fabulous museums one can see, none more so than the wonderful Acropolis Museum. Tonight, we celebrate our time together on this inspiring adventure at a local restaurant.

Days 26-28 We bid farewell to our Greek hosts and transfer to Athens International Airport for our flight to New Zealand via Dubai. NEW ZEALAND – SINGAPORE

Day 1 We depart New Zealand with a one night stopover in Singapore enroute to Paris.

SINGAPORE - PARIS

one night Singapore

three nights Paris

Days 2 We arrive in the romantic city of Paris, renowned for its classic style and arguably still the capital of couture, late in the evening. We'll transfer straight to our hotel, perfectly located close to many features of the city, heads full of anticipation for what lays ahead in the days to follow.



NEW ZEALAND – SINGAPORE

Day 1 We depart New Zealand with a one night stopover in Singapore enroute to Dubrovnik

SINGAPORE - DUBROVNIK

three nights Dubrovnik

one night Singapore

Days 2-3 On our arrival in Dubrovnik, we are transferred to our hotel in the area known as Lapad, with the tepid Adriatic at our feet!

Day 4 We begin our day with a walking tour through **the old, fortified town**, including a walk atop the wall itself. Of note are the Bell Tower clock, the 15th century Orlando's Column, Sponza Palace and the Dominican and Franciscan Monastery. The afternoon is yours to do as you please. You may like to stay a while longer in the old town and soak up the atmosphere, or perhaps return to our hotel and do some 'soaking' of a different kind in either the hotel pool or the warm clear waters of the Adriatic.

Day 5 Our excursion today takes us to one of the southernmost points of Croatia. Cavtat was an important Roman colony in this region and the second most important seaport. Today it's a tourist town full of cultural and historical monuments, and a fine example of the breath-taking Mediterranean beauty of this region.

DUBROVNIK – SPLIT

three nights Split

Day 6 Leaving the acclaimed 'Pearl of the Adriatic' this morning we head north along the coastline, destined for the captivating city of **Split**. Stopping for photo opportunities en route and lunch at the charming small town of Makarska, we arrive early afternoon, in plenty of time to enjoy the vibrant evening activity.

Day 7 Split was established around the remarkable palace built for the Roman Emperor Diocletian in his retirement. Many Roman and Gothic structures lie within the walls of the palace including the Temple of Jupiter and the Cathedral. After a leisurely stroll viewing the highlights of Split, the afternoon is yours to do as you please. You may like to go down to the esplanade and partake in some 'people watching' or possibly make your way up the steps at **Marjun** to a spectacular city vista from the top.

Day 8 This morning we're off to the medieval town of Trogir, its rich culture a combination of Greek, Roman and Venetian influences over a history of 2,300 years. The pretty town also boasts one of the best open-air markets in Croatia.

SPLIT – PLITVICE LAKES – OPATIJA

Day 9 Making our way northeast today with a number of comfort stops en route, our aim is to provide maximum time to enjoy the incredible natural beauty of World Heritage listed Plitvice Lakes, consisting of sixteen lakes and numerous waterfalls connected by kilometres of paths and wooden walkways amongst breathtaking scenery. Following lunch at the Lakes we continue northwest to the Istrian town of Opatija, one of the most colourfully painted towns you are ever likely to see. Our hotel is within easy reach of the waterfront, linked by a wonderful promenade that spans the length of the shoreline.

Day 10 A day at leisure to enjoy the shops, cafes, and bars along the waterfront, or take a refreshing swim in the warm waters of the **Kvarmer Gulf. Opatija** is the perfect place to put your feet up, relax and take it all in.

OPATIJA – PULA – ROVINJ

Day 11 With batteries fully charged we depart Opatija today, making our way first to Pula, best known for its incredibly well-preserved Roman amphitheatre, occupying a prominent position near the harbour and dating back to the 1st century. Continuing around the Istrian Peninsula our next stop is the charming seaside town of Rovinj.

two nights Opatija

three nights Rovinj

CROATIA. DALMATIA & ISTRIA



Days 12-13 The following two days are yours to do as you please. Rovinj's quaint cobbled streets are lined with artists' lairs and shops containing all manner of curios. A casual wander along the streets and alley-ways will inevitably lead you up to the Cathedral which punctuates this small town and offers an impressive view over the peninsular and beyond.

ROVINJ – POSTONJA – LAKE BLED

two nights Lake Bled

Day 14 We head north again today and enter Slovenia for the first time making a stop at the incredible caves at **Postonja**, Europe's biggest and one of the most spectacular caves in the world. Our tour here will include a ride in the **miniature train** 2 kms inside the caves before we continue by foot with a local guide telling us more of the fascinating history of the caves and pointing out the differing forms of stalactites and stalagmites.

We travel a few kilometers down the road from Postojna Cave, to experience the fairytale world of knights. The impregnable medieval **Predjama Castle** has sat perched in the middle of a 123-metre-high cliff for more than 800 years. Behind the largest cave castle in the world is a network of secret tunnels from where the knight Erazem of Predjama would set out on his expeditions.

We continue later in the afternoon, to the incredibly beautiful **Lake Bled**, our restful home for the next two nights. Lake Bled was formed from the recession of the Bohinj glacier. 2.1km long and up to 1.4km wide, the lake has a maximum depth of 30.6m. After the last Ice Age, the Bohinj glacier deepened the natural hollow giving shape to its present form. The basin was filled with water when the ice melted and is punctuated by the small island toward the west side of the lake.

Day 15 We start the day with a drive up to **Castle Bled**, perched in a most imposing position high above the Lake and seeming virtually impenetrable by any potential invading foe. The Castle is now home to an informative, modern museum. After this visit take time to enjoy the unspoiled beauty of Lake Bled at your leisure. You can circumnavigate the Lake by foot or bicycle, or maybe you'd prefer to be rowed out to the small island on a 'pletna', whence upon you might like to ring the bell to bestow good luck upon yourself!

LAKE BLED – LJUBLJANA – ZAGREB

Day 16 Our journey today includes some of the most picturesque scenery of our tour to date. Leaving the fairytale like Lake Bled behind us, we proceed to Ljubljana, where on arrival we will see the magnificent city hall, three bridges and other local sights. Following lunch we drive to Zagreb, Croatia's capital. On arrival we will make our way to the hotel where some may choose to relax, and others may want to take a short walk to some of the prominent and historic buildings in the general vicinity.

Day 17 We begin the day with a walking tour of Zagreb's historic old town. Zagreb is effectively divided into three sections. The Upper Town houses the multitude of **museums, galleries** and the **Croatian Parliament** on cobbled streets illuminated by gas lamps. Of note is the magnificent **St Marks Church** and its ornate roof resplendently covered with colourful ceramic tiles. Then there's the Lower Town with its shops, restaurants, cafés, theatre, and parks, and finally 'new Zagreb' notable for its high-rise buildings, corporate climate and not a tourist trap by any account.

Day 18 Today we take a short drive just outside of Zagreb to one of the finest examples of a restored castle at **Trakoscan**. Rooms have been lovingly restored and keep the authenticity of the period. There's an incredible room dedicated solely to weaponry and the views from the towers to the surrounding countryside are stunning. After this we will drive on to the charming small town of **Varazdin**, where we will have lunch in a local restaurant and a wander at your leisure before we make our way back to Zagreb.

ZAGREB – SINGAPORE – NEW ZEALAND

Days 19-22 A last chance for shopping or sightseeing today before we are taken by coach to the airport in the afternoon to begin our journey to New Zealand. Our return flight includes a one-night stopover en route, allowing time for some last-minute shopping, sightseeing or simply relaxing.

transit Singapore Day 1 We depart NZ, leaving the cool of winter behind as we head for the warmth of Singapore for our overnight transit before arriving in the heart of England.

SINGAPORE – MANCHESTER – YORK

three nights York

Day 2 On arrival in the UK we'll be transferred by coach to picturesque York, presenting excellent examples of Roman, Dark Age, Viking, and Medieval times. The walls surrounding the city are over two miles in length and with a history stretching back nearly2000 years. Today we head for Stoke Bruerne where we learn all about life on the Grand Canal which once bustled with traffic . Then it's on to the lights and pageantry of London.

Day 11 A full day of highlights in London including the Tower of London, Houses of Parliament, Big Ben, Westminster Abbey, and St Paul's Cathedral, among others. In the afternoon see it from a different perspective, as we cruise along the Thames.

Lying on the banks of the River Clyde, Glasgow boasts some of the finest Victorian architecture in the entire United Kingdom and elegant **Princes Square** offers excellent shopping.

Day 19 AT SEA

Day 20 KIRKWALL (Orkney Isles)

Bird watchers flock to the Orkney Islands. Fascinatingly, the Orkney Islands boast the greatest concentration of prehistoric sites in all Europe, including the mysterious **Ring of Brodgar** and 5,000-year-old **Skara Brae**. Vikings - Norsemen - ruled the Orkney Islands from the 9th to 13th centuries.

Day 21 INVERGORDON (Inverness)

This northernmost city in the United Kingdom dates to the 6th century. The early 19th century castle, built on the same site of its medieval predecessor, is now a sheriff court. The **Culloden** visitor centre features a state-of-the-art exhibition bringing the battle alive when the British troops defeated **Bonnie Prince Charlie** and the Highland clans in 1746.

Day 22 EDINBURGH

After disembarking at Queensferry we head to the city's most famous landmark - **Edinburgh Castle**, offering commanding views of the city and countryside. Meander the **Royal Mile** stopping to visit little museums, churches, cafes and stores all the way down to **Holyrood Palace** and the **Scottish Parliament Building**.

DAY 23 At sea today. Sit back and relax or avail yourself of the many ships' facilities at your disposal.

DAY 24 LE HAVRE (Normandy)

Le Havre is France's second largest port. Almost completely destroyed by bombing it is now a **UNESCO World Heritage** site and considered an outstanding example of modern architecture. Enjoy wandering on foot or by Hop on Hop off Bus. There are also excellent optional shore excursions to **Monet's Garden**, and the **Normandy beaches** (D Day landings).

DAY 25 SOUTHAMPTON

two nights Southampton

After disembarkation today we travel to the New Forest area to visit **Beaulieu**, home to the **National Motor Museum**, **Palace House** and **Gardens** and **Beaulieu Abbey**. Whatever your interest, cars, gardens or stately homes, there is something for everyone to enjoy here.

Day 26 Excursion to Bath via **Stonehenge**. The Great Roman Temple and bathing complex built 2,000 years ago is one of the country's finest monuments. Learn all about it with an audio guide when we visit the **Roman Baths** and **Pump Rooms.**

SOUTHAMPTON - HEATHROW - SINGAPORE



NEW ZEALAND – HOUSTON – NEW ORLEANS

three nights New Orleans Day 1 Today the adventure begins, starting with our flights to New Orleans. On arrival we'll be transferred directly to our hotel.

Day 2 Today we'll see some of the more notable sights of this great city including the French Quarter, legendary Café du Monde and the 18th century St Louis Cathedral. We'll give you time to wander the expansive French market, and no visit to New Orleans would be complete without experiencing vibrant Bourbon Street and its attractive tributaries. This evening we're off to a jazz club for dinner and some southern hospitality!

Day 3 Today's a free day. Maybe you'd like to pop your head into the Jax Brewery shopping mall, or have another look around French Market. There's also the excellent National WWII Museum for those interested in military history.

NEW ORLEANS – NATCHEZ

one night Natchez Day 4 We make our way north following the mighty Mississippi. Our feature stop today is the elaborate Oak Alley Plantation, the 'Grande Dame' of river road plantations. After lunch on-site we continue north to Natchez, and our majestic 19th century hotel for the night.

NATCHEZ – TUPELO

one night Tupelo **Day 5** Our first stop today is the historic battle site of **Vicksburg**, where we'll be joined by a park ranger for a guided tour of one of the Union's most significant victories in the American Civil War. We'll also have the opportunity to look over one of the best-preserved gunboats, 'Cairo' from this conflict.

TUPELO – MEMPHIS

two nights Memphis

Day 6 Tupelo is known for many things, but none more-so than its claim to fame as the original home of one of Rock 'n' Roll's greatest legends, Elvis Presley.

In Memphis, we continue along the music theme, including the Rock 'n' Soul Museum, and a recording studio credited with making some of the biggest Rock 'n' Roll artists household names, and often referred to as the 'Birthplace' of Rock 'n' Roll, Sun Studios. Tonight's another highlight, dinner at B.B King's Blues Club!

Day 7 Today we're off to see the National Civil Rights Museum, graphically portraying the story of the struggle from the resistance to slavery, the role played in the Civil War and defiant acts such as the 'Montgomery Bus Boycott' and 'Freedom Rides' amongst others. There's also an optional tour to Graceland, Elvis Presley's mansion, featuring many incredible exhibits including his private planes, car and motorbike collection, mansion, and grounds.

MEMPHIS – NASHVILLE

three nights Nashville Day 8 We exchange the strains of R&B, Rock n Roll, Soul, and Gospel music today, for what is widely regarded as the home of country music, Nashville Tennessee. We'll see the highlights of this great city including the Ryman Auditorium, opened in 1892 and the home of the Grand Ole Opry from 1943-1974. We'll drive down Music Row, past historic RCA Studio B and see Nashville's answer to the Greek Parthenon amongst other things.

Day 9 Our first stop is the famous recording studios, RCA Studio B, where top selling artists recorded over 35,000 songs and produced over 1,000 hit records. We may even have the opportunity to lay down our own track. After this we make our way to the Country Music Hall of Fame. Tonight, we're off to a highlight dinner on the General Jackson Showboat!

Day 10 Free day. This evening there's an optional tour to a performance at the Grand Ole Opry. Even if you're not a country music fan, you're certain to enjoy the performances of some talented musicians and the electric atmosphere.

NASHVILLE – FORT LAUDERDALE

Day 11 This morning we leave Nashville on our flight to Ft Lauderdale. Arriving just after midday, the time is yours to do as you please. Go walking along the many boardwalks that feature in this area, shop at the impressive Sawgrass Mills Mall, or just relax around the hotel.

Battery Park via the historic, Charging Bull of Wall Street to the reflective 9/11 Memorial where once stood the World Trade Centre. Day 15 Bonaire, Caribbean Netherlands is a small Dutch country of 17,500 residents. One of the most notable attractions are the **'white mountains'** waiting to be shipped out and the salt flats where the salt evaporates from the Caribbean Sea, which also happens to be home to another icon of Bonaire, the **pink flamingo.**

Day 16 Aruba is a contrast: the island's arid interior is dotted with cactus and windswept Divi Divi trees, while secluded coves and sandy beaches make up its coast.

Day 17 Curacao. Lying some 40 miles off Venezuela, Curaçao boasts a landscape that is dramatic, stark, and volcanic. In contrast, Willemstad, the capital, seems a cozy Dutch haven with its neat row houses. And while those gabled and tiled roofs illustrate the island's heritage, the **bright, pastel houses speak pure Caribbean**.

Day 18 We're at sea today.



Day 19 Barbados locals describe their country as being **"more English than England she-self"** but look around and you know you're not in England: rich and fertile tropical fields meet a glistening, azure sea. The soft pastels of old chattel houses blend with the vibrant reds, oranges, and greens of roadside fruit stands.

Day 20 Dominica lies between Guadeloupe and Martinique and is an unspoiled island Caribbean paradise. The vibrant, rich rainforest is home to many rare birds, including Jacquot parrots. Dominica is also home to the last Carib Indians.

Day 21 St Maarten is the Dutch half of an Island divided by language alone. From the capital Phillipsburg several interesting sightseeing tours are available, or you can simply enjoy the city on foot. This is the place where aircraft seem to barely clear the beach as they come into land. Spectacular!

Day 22 San Juan, Puerto Rico. The oldest city under the American flag. There's an unmistakable zest in the air here. Perhaps it's the stunning natural setting: the verdant peaks, tropical forests, and gleaming white-sand beaches. All we know is, San Juan is one of the most enticing ports in the Caribbean, and it only gets lovelier with age.

Day 23-25 At Sea. The beauty about sea days is that it's the perfect time to do as little or as much as you please. The cruise ship boasts a raft of activities for those who want to get involved. There are numerous sporting pursuits available, a well-resourced library, craft activities, shopping, cafés, movies, quiz games and so much more. - 2. Travel 2U is not responsible for any failure on the part of our service providers such as airlines, coach operators, hotels or cruise companies.
- 3. Travel 2U reserves the right to alter or change the accommodation, carrier or coaches at any time for any reason. Travel 2U reserves the right to cancel or alter the itinerary for any reason whatsoever including, but not limited to, road, weather or traffic conditions, non-performance of suppliers, industrial action, operational conditions and requirements. All additional expenses incurred as a result of any delays, cancellations or alterations will be the sole responsibility of the passenger.
- 4. A minimum number of bookings are required to operate a tour and also to ensure an enjoyable small group atmosphere. Where sufficient numbers cannot be achieved, Travel 2U reserves the right to cancel the tour.
- Where a tour is cancelled prior to departure, accordingly to clause 4 above, a full refund will apply.
- 6. Any special passenger requirements must be notified to Travel 2U at the time of booking. No passenger will be permitted to embark or continue on the tour while their mental or physical condition, in the opinion of the representative of Travel 2U is such as to render them incapable of caring for themselves, or whereby they become objectionable to other passengers, or they become a hazard to themselves or other passengers. - Travel 2U can give no guarantee as to the exact arrival and departure times for carriers and operators used by Travel 2U in the tour. Travel 2U will not be liable for failure to make connections with any other services and/or missed tour inclusions.
- Travel 2U reserves the right to cancel any ticket or booking or to refuse to carry any
