NEW ZEALAND - SINGAPORE

one niaht Sinaapore

Days 1-2 Departing New Zealand today on Singapore Airlines, our magnificent destination is *Istanbul*, the only city in the world to span two continents, Asia and Europe. En-route we'll have a brief stay in the Changi Airport Transit Hotel.

SINGAPORE - ISTANBUL

three nights Istanbul

Days 3-4 After a morning arrival in Istanbul, we'll enjoy a brief orientation tour of the European side of the city, *Omer, our Turkish guide* will point out some of the more significant places of interest, many of which we'll be returning to over the next few days to experience in depth. We'll make our way to our hotel, where the remainder of the day is yours to relax and get settled in. Our hotel is perfectly positioned in the *old city* close to many famous sites which are within minutes walking distance.

Over the next two days we'll show you some of the greatest highlights of this wonderful city, including the *Blue Mosque, Topkapi Palace*, the *Hippodrome*, *Hagia Sophia*, *Cistern Basilica*, *Egyptian Spice Market*, *Grand Bazaar* and more. We'll also have the pleasure of an afternoon cruise on the *Bosphorus*.

ISTANBUL - CANAKKALE

one night Canakkale

Day 5 We start the day a little earlier as we have some ground to cover making our way south west toward the *Gallipoli Peninsula*. Arriving around midday we begin our visit at *ANZAC Cove*, before continuing to *Lone Pine Cemetery* and of particular importance to New Zealanders, *Chanuk Bair*, where many of our soldiers from that ill-fated campaign are remembered. Learn about the tragic losses, along with the heroic and compassionate acts carried out by soldiers from both sides during the campaign. Late afternoon we cross the *Dardanelle Strait* by ferry to Canakkale (Cannon Castle) and our overnight stay.

CANAKKALE - TROY - IZMIR

one niaht Izmir

Day 6 A short hop to start the day as we head firstly to Troy. Despite popular belief there is more to *Troy* than just the *Trojan Horse*. See the *remnants of nine cities* built one upon the other, the first dating back to the 3rd millennium and really highlighting the importance of Troy's strategic location. The catalyst for the *Trojan Wars* (1180 BC) was again ignited over 3,000 years later at Gallipoli.

We continue on to *Pergamon* via scenic farmlands and fig plantations where, time permitting, we will stop and give you the opportunity to purchase some of the wonderful produce. Pergamon is located on fertile plains, punctuated by steep hills and the seemingly inaccessible fortress better known as the *Acropolis*. Rich in archaeological sites and steeped in history Pergamon and Izmir *(Smyrna)* are two of the *Seven Churches* in the *New Testament Book of Revelations* written by *John the Apostle*.

IZMIR - EPHESUS - PAMUKKALE (Cotton Castle)

two niahts Pamukkale

Day 7 Today we visit two stunning sights. Travelling predominantly across fertile farmland we skirt the ancient city of *Ephesus*, the third church visited on this trip that is mentioned in the *Book of Revelations*. Our first stop is at the *House of the Virgin Mary*. It is believed St John brought Mary to Ephesus after the crucifixion, where she spent her remaining years. We continue on to the archaeological sight of Ephesus itself, entering the city via the ancient *Agora*. We walk the famous *Marble Road*, see the stunning *Library of Celsus, Temple of Hadrian, Hercules Gate* and the magnificent *Stadium*. We'll stop for lunch in a quaint country restaurant before embarking on our next highlight of the day *Aphrodisias*, home to one of a few remaining *Tetrapylon Gates* in the world, a magnificent theatre, the *Temple of Aphrodite* and one of the best preserved examples of an early stadium you'll find. We continue on to Pamukkale, to enjoy the wonderful facilities on offer at our thermal spa resort before dinner.

Day 8 This morning we visit the ancient *Hierapolis* to see the famous white *travertine terraces* and pools. After bathing our feet in the soothing thermal springs there is ample time to visit the *Agora*, the magnificent *Theatre* and the *Martyrium of St Philip*, one of the twelve apostles who died here in 87 AD. For those interested in old bones and ornate crypts, this afternoon you will be fascinated when we visit the elaborate *Necropolis* (ancient cemetery).

PAMUKKALE - ANTALYA

two nights Antalya

Day 9 As we cross the *Taurus Mountains* and pass pine forests today, we make our way to the sea and one of Turkey's most archaeologically significant cities, *Antalya*. Excavations near this area uncovered artefacts dating back as far as 1900 BC. It was also from Antalya that the *Knights of St John* set sail to Palestine during the Crusades.

GREECE, TURKEY & THE MED

Day 10 A day at leisure today. Explore more of the *Old Town*, relax by the pool for a while, or perhaps make your way down to the beautiful blue Mediterranean for a refreshing swim. Our hotel is perfectly positioned to make the most of this tremendous coastal location.

ANTALYA – KONYA one night Konya

Day 11 We climb the Taurus Mountains again today and view some of the prettiest scenery in Turkey. Our destination is *Konya*, origin of the *Whirling Dervishes* of Mevlana, a religious sect formed in the 13th century by Jalauddin Rumi, a mystic, poet and Sufi Muslim.

KONYA - CAPPADOCIA

two nights Cappadocia

Day 12 Today we travel across the *Anatolian Plain* following the route of the old *Silk Road*, destination *Cappadocia*. We see a number of *Caravanserai* along the route, an ancient hotel and safe haven for the camel caravans during their long journey. We'll also show you how silk is transformed from the raw material into beautiful carpets! Words cannot do justice to the region of Cappadocia, a landscape dotted with *fairy-chimneys*, *underground dwellings* and *monasteries* carved out of hillsides. Entire cities exist underground, some as deep as 12 floors down!

Day 13 For those who have elected to, we start the day early with an incredible flight over the sparse plains and fairy chimneys of the Urgup/Goreme region in our *Hot Air Balloon*. Following champagne to celebrate and a good breakfast we take you to explore the beautifully preserved Tuff cave dwellings and churches at the *Goreme Open Air Museum*, complete with colourful frescos depicting religious scenes from the Christian faith dating back as far as the 10th century AD.

CAPPADOCIA – ISTANBUL – ATHENS

one night Athens

Day 14 This morning we depart Cappadocia and bid farewell to Turkey, flying to Istanbul and on to *Athens*, where an overnight stay awaits before we join our Greek Island cruise.

seven nights Celestyal

Days 15-22 The *Celestyal Crystal* has a yacht inspired design with classic teak decks which evoke an intimate atmosphere. Step aboard and enter a world where modern technology meets grand era of ocean travel. With a maximum of 1,200 guests on board and a crew of 406 to ensure passengers are well cared for, the cruise features authentic local experiences from each region and you'll enjoy all-inclusive meals and drinks as well as comfort and extra special touches with our additional services.

ATHENS three nights Athens

Day 22 *Athens*, the ancient centre of the arts, learning and philosophy, and regarded as the cradle of Western civilisation and democracy. Upon disembarkation we visit highlights of this famous Olympic city including the original *Olympic Stadium*, the *Acropolis* and *Pantheon* atop *Temple of Nike* and see *Hadrian's Gate*, plus many points of interest along the way. This evening to really immerse ourselves in the Greek way of living we're going to dine in a local restaurant located in the narrow cobbled streets of *Athens old town*, the *Plaka*. We'll be entertained by local singers and musicians and enjoy a wonderful night of traditional Greek fare accompanied by fine wines and ouzo, the local Greek drink of choice.

EXCURSION TO DELPHI

Day 23 Leaving Athens for the day we explore the Greek countryside on a day trip to *Delphi*, sanctuary to the god *Apollo*. En-route we pass the distant fields of *Marathon* and *Mt Pentelikon* where marble was mined for the construction of the Pantheon. Nestled in the bosom of *Mt Parnassus*, Delphi is rich in mythology and Greek legend, and it is to the Temple of Apollo ancient Greeks came to seek the wisdom of the *Oracle*. Conjecture still remains as to when Delphi was constructed, however academics widely accept the city existed 3,500 years ago.

ATHENS

Day 24 Today is yours at leisure to explore on foot. There is still so much to see in very close proximity to our hotel. We'll take you sightseeing, shopping or exploring whatever you have on your to do list! The Plaka area has many fascinating things to see and experience and is worth exploring during the day. There are also many fabulous museums one can see, none more so than the wonderful Acropolis Museum. Tonight we celebrate our time together on this inspiring adventure at a local restaurant.

ATHENS - SINGAPORE

transit Singapore

Days 25-26 We bid farewell to our Greek hosts and transfer to Athens International Airport for our flight to Singapore. Arriving Singapore early morning we have a full day in transit en-route to New Zealand.

SINGAPORE - NEW ZEALAND

Day 27 We arrive in Christchurch this morning, full of memories of time spent with new found friends, experiences beyond expectation and a greater appreciation for this wonderful part of the world.

CRUISING





Day 15 *Athens* Today is at leisure until mid-afternoon when we transfer to Piraeus to join our cruise ship MS Celestyal Crystal. **6pm** we depart Piraeus bound for Kusadasi.

Day 16 *Kusadasi* This former seaside village is now a popular Aegean resort town. Streets bustle with vendors of *carpets*, *leather goods* and books, and the customary ice-cream sellers. There's a shopping mall with sleek jewellery stores and European fashion boutiques. For the energetic, consider a walk along the peninsular to see the castle on Güvercinada (Pigeon Island).

Day 17 *Rhodes* Famed as the island of sun, sea and sand, it is the third largest Greek island and (unofficially) the sunniest place in Europe. Built by the *Knights of St John*, it was an important stopover point en-route to Palestine and the Crusades. The mighty statue of *Colossus* once stood guarding the harbour, one of the *Seven Wonders of the Ancient World*. Rhodes combines the cosmopolitan character of a contemporary city with the picturesque character of a medieval town. It's a wonderful accessible place to explore by foot, with a plethora of things to see and do to fill your day, and that's what we recommend.

Day 18 Heraklion, Crete Also known as Iraklio, Heraklion is the capital of Crete. Here pedestrian streets connect historic squares and arcaded walkways with the wonderful medieval centre. Stroll the promenade where you see traditional fishing boats moored. Pop-in to one of the many small seafront tavernas and try a freshly caught grilled fish washed down with a refreshingly cool drink! Heraklion is renowned for the incredible Palace of Knossos, built by the Minoan civilisation around 3200 BC. An excursion to Knossos is included in today's program.

Day 19 Santorini Cruising toward Santorini is something magical. Whitewashed houses and blue-domed churches perched atop lofty cliffs above the blue Aegean promises visitors adventure coupled with legendary tales. Strolling the gleaming white streets of *Oia* and her larger cousin *Thira* through a labyrinth of cafés, shops, taverna and galleries is to experience a living postcard. The changing vistas over the caldera from the cliff-top is stunning, and everything we imagine of a Greek Island.

Day 20 Santorini – Milos – Mykonos Milos is renowned for its stunningly clear blue waters, pristine beaches and lacy coastline. It's a beach lover's dream with over 75 beaches in an area covering 160 square kms. By comparison Christchurch covers an area of 1400 square kms! It's RnR on Milos, and for the non-beach goers the seaside town of Adamas has plenty to keep one occupied.

Day 21 *Mykonos* A vibrant blend of art and culture and carefree Mediterranean lifestyle is an apt description of Mykonos. The town is easy to navigate, its cobbled whitewashed streets brimming with *fabulous boutiques* and *galleries*. The area of town referred to as *Little Venice* has the iconic *windmills*, and an abundance of quaint taverna, cafés and restaurants specialising in local fare. Beautiful beaches, ancient ruins and a photographer's paradise, Mykonos has it all.

Day 22 Athens Arriving back in Athens we're met by our local guide.





Colourful history, impressive architecture and a variety of scenery awaits you as we explore Great Britain and Ireland at a leisurely pace. With a number of two and three night stops you will truly experience the historical cities, quaint villages and bustling market towns. We've included some unique journeys such as a canal trip on the Grand Union Canal and a train across the Yorkshire Moors along with visits to Lord Nelson's Ship at Portsmouth, the Royal Yacht Britannia, the Titanic Exhibition and the Giants Causeway. There simply isn't a more comprehensive UK and Ireland experience to be found.

NEW ZEALAND - SINGAPORE

transit Singapore

Day 1 We depart New Zealand, leaving the cool of winter behind as we head for the warmth of Singapore for our overnight transit before arriving in the heart of England.

SINGAPORE - MANCHESTER - YORK

three nights York

Day 2 On arrival we'll be transferred by coach to picturesque *York*. York is totally unique offering examples of Roman, Dark Age, Viking, and Medieval times. The walls surrounding the city are over two miles in length and with a history stretching back nearly 2,000 years. We'll take a wander and familiarise ourselves with the city of York before giving you the rest of the day to relax.

Day 3 We spend the day exploring all the city has to offer. There is time to visit the *Jorviik Centre*, wander the quaint cobbled streets 'the Shambles' and pay a visit to the famed 'Minster'. Train enthusiasts will enjoy a visit to the renowned National Railway Museum, with a collection of over 100 locomotives including The Royal Carriages.

Day 4 Today we take an excursion to the *Yorkshire Moors* and *Captain Cook Country*. Our coach takes us to the town of Pickering where we board a train to cross the *Yorkshire Moors*. Our journey takes us via *Goathland Station* (featured in the TV series Heartbeat and in the Harry Potter movies). We disembark at the old whaling town of *Whitby* with time to meander and descend the steps from the old Abbey. It was here that Captain Cook began his apprenticeship, learning about navigation and seamanship.

YORK - EDINBURGH

three nights Edinburgh

Day 5 We drive through *Northumberland* stopping at Alnwick to view the spectacular gardens and castle which was a key filming site for *Harry Potter* and *Downton Abbey*. Scotland here we come!

Days 6-7 During our time in Edinburgh we will visit famous *Edinburgh Castle*, which houses the Scottish crown jewels. We walk the *Royal Mile* past bagpipe makers, whiskey and kilt sellers to the *Palace of Holyrood House*, the Queen's official Scottish residence. There is time to take tea and scones and a tour of her majesty's former *Royal Yacht Britannia* which gives an insight into the Royal family's life at sea. Enjoy some leisure time to explore, shop or perhaps research your family tartan at the *Tartan Centre*. A Scottish dinner and entertainment is included.

EDINBURGH - PITLOCHRY - INVERNESS

one night Inverness

Day 8 Leaving Edinburgh we cross the Forth Road Bridge and head into the Highlands stopping at the quaint town of *Pitlochry* en route to Inverness, the capital of the Highlands. We end the day with a visit to *Culloden* – where Bonnie Prince Charlie's army was defeated by the English.

INVERNESS - LOCH NESS - THE TROSSACHS

one night The Trossachs

Day 9 Our journey, steeped in history, takes us along the *banks of Loch Ness*, keep your eyes peeled for the monster! On to Fort William in the shadow of *Ben Nevis*, Britain's highest mountain and haunting Glen Coe, where in 1692 the Campbell Soldiers slaughtered the McDonalds. We spend the night in the *Trossachs* – a beautiful place once inhabited by rogues – the most well-known being Rob Roy McGregor! Exquisite scenery awaits you – lush lowlands, misty peaks and the bonnie banks of *Loch Lomond*.

THE TROSSACHS - LAKE DISTRICT

two nights Lake District

Day 10 Leaving the wild landscapes of Scotland behind we drive to the tranquil Lake District. It was here that such writers as *Beatrix Potter* and *William Wordsworth* found their inspiration and the scenery continues to fuel the creative spirits of poets and artists to this day. En-route we'll stop at *Gretna Green*, renowned for runaway weddings and still a popular place for weddings today.

Day 11 A leisurely day is in store to cruise on *Lake Windermere*. Options include cruising around the islands, visiting Ambleside or cruising to Lakeside to visit the Motor Museum and ride a Steam Train.

LAKE DISTRICT – CHESTER – STRATFORD UPON AVON three night

three nights Stratford upon Avon

Day 12 We journey south to *Chester* with its unique black and white shopping arcades and Roman history. Onwards to the home of *Shakespeare*. A beautiful part of England and we have three nights to experience it! Along with some fascinating day trips we'll have time to meander through picturesque villages with thatched roof cottages oozing with charm.

Day 13 At the edge of town we visit *Ann Hathaway's* lovely thatched cottage. The afternoon takes us to impressive *Warwick Castle* – the finest medieval castle in England. Experience a thousand lifetimes as you see the richly furnished staterooms, the Armoury, Watergate Tower, jousting knights and archery displays that recapture key moments of Britain's History. We return to *Stratford upon Avon* to see the birthplace of Shakespeare and enjoy time strolling around this historic riverside town.

Day 14 In their heyday the canals transported tons of supplies all over the country. When trains and modern transport took over, canal traffic dwindled and these days they are mostly used for leisurely journeys. Today we head for *Stoke Bruerne* where we learn all about life on the canal and take a ride on a canal boat on the *Grand Union Canal* which once bustled with traffic.

ENGLAND, IRELAND & SCOTLAND

STRATFORD UPON AVON - BATH

two nights Bath

Day 15 Today we visit the pretty village of *Bourton on Water* then head for the ancient spa city of *Bath* where novelist Jane Austen once lived. The *Great Roman Temple* and bathing complex built 2,000 years ago is one of the country's finest monuments. Learn all about this with an audio guide when we visit the *Roman Baths and Pump Rooms*.

NEW ZEALAND - HOUSTON - NEW ORLEANS

three nights New Orleans

Day 1 Today the adventure begins, starting with our Air New Zealand flight to Houston, and connecting flight to New Orleans. On arrival we'll be transferred to our hotel where we'll enjoy a leisurely welcome dinner this evening. Afterwards, for the night owls, we'll take a stroll along the famous **Bourbon Street**.

Day 3 Today's yours to do as you please. Perhaps re-visit Bourbon Street, or explore the *extensive WWll Museum*, touted as the best in the USA and easily reached by tramcar, which we suggest is the best way to get you around the city. From Canal Street you can reach the river and do a *paddle-wheeler cruise*, or shopping at the outlet shops. A change of tram will take you to the French Market, or you can take a stroll around *Jackson Square* and pop your head into the *Jax Brewery Shopping Mall*.

NEW ORLEANS – BATON ROUGE – NATCHEZ

one night Natchez

Day 4 Our touring coach meets us this morning and we make our way north following the mighty *Mississippi*. Our first stop is the beautiful *Oak Alley Plantation*, the 'Grande Dame' of river road plantations. There'll be an opportunity to look around the out-buildings where 'the help' lived, followed by an informative guided tour of the 'Big House'. We'll have lunch here before continuing on to *Baton Rouge*, then to our destination on the banks of the Mississippi River, *Natchez*. Tonight *we rest our heads in our very own antebellum homestead*, dating back to the early 19th century.

NATCHEZ - VICKSBURG - TUPELO

one night Tupelo

Day 5 Leaving Natchez this morning we'll be travelling via the *Natchez Trace Parkway* as much as possible, stopping at *Vicksburg* for a guided tour with a park ranger of the site of one of the Union's most significant victories in the *American Civil War*. We'll also see the well preserved remains of one of the famous *Union gunships, Cairo*, permanently on display.

TUPELO - MEMPHIS

two nights Memphis

Day 6 Before leaving Tupelo today we make a brief stop at the original home of one of Rock 'n' Roll's biggest stars, *Elvis Presley*. The humble family home built by Vernon Presley, Elvis's father, stands as it did when first constructed back in 1934.

On arrival in *Memphis* we visit a recording studio credited with making some of the biggest Rock 'n' Roll artists household names and often referred to as the 'Birthplace' of Rock 'n' Roll, *Sun Studio*. Our guided tour takes us behind the scenes of the studio and our knowledgeable guide might just reveal a few unknown secrets of the stars.

Our next stop is the incredible, and moving, *National Civil Rights Museum*, located in the Lorraine Motel, the very motel Martin Luther King Jr was assassinated in. The display houses over 260 artifacts telling the story of the African American struggle from the resistance to slavery, to the role played in the American Civil War and defiant acts such as the 'Montgomery Bus Boycott' and 'Freedom Rides' amongst others.

Day 7 This morning after a leisurely breakfast there's an *optional tour to Graceland*, Elvis Presley's mansion featuring many incredible exhibits including his private planes, car and motorbike collection and including entry to the mansion itself and grounds. For those choosing not to do this, the time is yours to explore more of Memphis from our perfectly positioned hotel. After lunch we'll enjoy a fascinating self-guided audio tour through the golden age of music at the *Rock 'n' Soul Museum*.

MEMPHIS - NASHVILLE

three nights Nashville

Day 8 We exchange the home of Rock 'n' Roll today, for what is widely regarded as the 'Home of Country Music', Nashville, Tennessee. In the afternoon we'll meet our local guide who'll show us some of the highlights of this great city including the Ryman Auditorium, which opened in 1892 and home of the Grand Ole Opry from 1943-1974, also Nashville's answer to the Greek Parthenon amongst other things.

Day 9 After a great breakfast this morning we make our way to the *Country Music Hall of Fame* where accompanied by an audio guide, you're free to wander at your leisure until we gather again late morning and visit the famous recording studios of *RCA Studio B*, where top selling artists recorded over 35,000 songs and produced over 1,000 hit records.

Day 10 It's a free day today for you to spend how you please. That might entail more time on *Music Row*, perhaps some retail therapy, lunch at one of the dozens of top muso' clubs, or maybe some general sightseeing on foot. Mid afternoon we're off to the very popular and extensive *Opry Mills Mall*, where we'll also have dinner before being guests at one of the most iconic live music shows in the US, *the Grand Ole Opry!*

NASHVILLE - BIRMINGHAM

one night Birmingham

Day 11 It's time to hit the road again, and what better way to enjoy the natural beauty of Tennessee and Alabama than by driving the scenic *Natchez Trace Parkway* for the first part of our journey, stopping at *Muscle Shoals* (home of the famous Muscle Shoals Sound Studio) for lunch, before continuing to Birmingham.

Day 12 Our guide joins us this morning to enlighten us on some of the history, intrinsically woven into every mile of our journey today. The first stop is *Selma*, recently the subject of a blockbuster movie documenting the civil rights movement and struggle against segregation, culminating in the famous march from Selma to Montgomery headed by civil rights campaigner Martin Luther King Jr. What ensued was a brutal assault against the marchers by state troopers and local police on the *Edmund Pettus Bridge*. We'll walk over the same bridge and try to imagine the events of 7 March 1965, a date that thereafter would be known as Bloody Sunday.

Day 13 After a big day yesterday we thought it would be good to let you do as you please today. Within a very short walk of our hotel you'll find yourself in *Centennial Olympic Park*. From there it's another easy walk to the intriguing and worthwhile *World of Coca Cola*, and virtually next door the incredible *Georgia Aquarium*. Also in the vicinity you can take a look *behind the scenes at CNN*, then wander back to the park and take a ride on the giant ferris wheel known as *Skyview Atlanta*. If art's more your thing, Atlanta boasts one of the state's best at the *High Museum of Art*.

ATLANTA - MIAMI

Day 14 We bid farewell to Georgia this morning as we make our way to the airport for our flight to Miami. On arrival we'll be taken by coach to the cruise ship terminal to join our floating resort, the MSC Armonia.

CRUISING

seven nights MSC

Days 14-21 We board our luxurious ship this afternoon and around 7pm we'll be casting off to begin our exploration of some of the most fascinating Caribbean ports o' call over the following eight days. *MSC Armonia* is a Premium class ship, accommodating up to 2,600 passengers over 13 decks, with every whim attended to by her 765 dedicated crew. MSC Armonia has a classic ambience, luxurious features and beautifully appointed Balcony Staterooms, which you'll enjoy for the duration of our cruise. On board, the list of amenities is extensive and impressive. There's an elegant bathing complex with outdoor pools, jacuzzis and for those wanting to maintain a level of fitness after a few guilty pleasures from dinner the night before, a state-of-the-art gym. Day 15 Today you can put your feet up and relax or explore the many fine guest amenities on offer around the ship, as today is a full day at sea.

ISLE DE ROATAN, HONDURAS

Day 16 Only approximately 50km long and on average only 2-4km wide. Surrounded by beautiful beaches it's a snorkeler's paradise. Still largely in its natural condition with a mountainous pine forested interior, but with clear evidence of intensifying development. One of the features of Roatan is the *Iguana sanctuary*, where in addition to dozens of Iguana you are also likely to see *Macaws and Monkeys*.

COSTA MAYA, MEXICO

Day 17 The two towns in the area, Mahahual and the smaller Xcalak, were hit hard by Hurricane Dean in 2007. Mahahual was rebuilt, but Xcalak is still quite battered. *Costa Maya* is known as the landing point for access to some of the most incredible reminders of *Mayan* occupation. In particular we recommend a visit to *Kohunlich*. The ruins, seldom visited by anyone other than enormous butterflies and wild parrots, are beautifully situated, peering out above the treetops. The buildings date from the late pre-Classic to the Classic periods (100–900 AD). Foliage has reclaimed most of them, except for the *Templo de los Mascarones*, which is named after the five 2m-high stucco masks that decorate its facade. These wide-eyed, open-mouthed images of the sun god, *Kinich Ahau*, once stared out from a background of smooth, bright-red-painted stucco. *Kinichná's hulking pyramid*, built in metre-high stones, layer upon layer by successive leaders, barely clears the trees, but the view out over the surrounding terrain is breathtaking.

ISLAND OF COZUMEL, MEXICO

Day 18 A little further north along the Yucatan Peninsular we arrive at *Cozumel*. Such is the clarity of the water and abundance of marine life that Cozumel is a mecca for divers and snorkelers. Further evidence of Mayan occupation is also to be found here. Not surprisingly *white sandy beaches abound* and sun lovers won't want to leave! There's also more than one producer of chocolate on the Island.

CARIBBEAN

Days 19-20 Over the following two days we will be cruising the beautiful azure blue waters of the Caribbean. Due to reasons beyond our control at the time of going to print, details of port visits during this time have yet to be confirmed.

Day 21 Cruising through the night, we arrive back at the *Port of Miami* early this morning where our coach and guide will be waiting to take us to downtown Miami, for a short tour of some of the cities highlights, many mirroring life in Cuba. There'll also be an opportunity to grab a bite to eat and have a wander at your leisure before re-joining our coach for our short trip to Miami airport to begin our flights homewards.

BERLIN - MUNICH - SINGAPORE



NEW ZEALAND - VANCOUVER

three nights Vancouver

Day 1 This afternoon we begin our journey of discovery into the best of Canada and Alaska. Welcome to *Vancouver!* Upon arrival we will be met and transferred to our hotel. The rest of the day is at leisure.

Day 2 Our full day tour today encompasses many of the attractions that make Vancouver such a special place, besides the natural beauty of its mountain backdrop and blue Pacific waters. Enter *Stanley Park*, with 1,000 acres of majestic evergreens. It was described by one local writer as a thousand-acre therapeutic couch, and boasts 10kms of scenic seawall. Experience the citys kaleidoscope of cultural heritage with visits to *West Coast Native Totem Poles*, British-flavoured *Gastown* (named after Yorkshire born *'Gassy' Jack*) with its unique steam clock, and colourful *Chinatown*, second in size only to San Francisco's. Also highlighted in the days sightseeing will be *Lions Gate Bridge*, *Prospect Point* and *English Bay*. Later this morning we take a ride up *Grouse Mountain* for spectacular views of Vancouver, an entertaining lumberjack show and hopefully your chance to see some *bears!* We then go on to the historic *Capilano Suspension Bridge*, one of the world's longest suspension bridges stretching 450 feet across and 230 feet above the *Capilano Canyon!* While enjoying our visit, time will be allowed to explore the surrounding Nature Park which offers meandering trails and a *tree-top walk* through an old-growth forest.

Day 3 A free day to explore this beautiful city.

VANCOUVER - CALGARY

three nights Calgary

Day 4 Today we are transferred to Vancouver Airport for our flight to Calgary. After settling into our hotel we will take a short orientation walk to familiarise ourselves with the surrounding area. Our hotel is located opposite the *Calgary Tower* from where we will have great views of the city.

Day 5 Experience the fever that holds Calgary in its grip during the annual *Calgary Exhibition* and *Stampede*, universally acclaimed as '*The Greatest Outdoor Show on Earth'*. The Stampede showcases the best in rodeo with numerous events, exhibits and diverse entertainment. We have reserved afternoon rodeo tickets.

Day 6 A free morning to explore Calgary or if you prefer a full day to enjoy all the excitement of the famous Calgary Stampede including reserved tickets for the evening *Chuck Wagon Races* and *Show*. (The show is a highlight in itself and runs for approximately 3 hours, including fireworks).

CALGARY - BANFF

two nights Banff

Day 7 We are joined by our driver guide this morning who will accompany us for the next five days. Making our way west we join the Trans Canadian Highway, and watch the Olympic city dissolve into the foothills behind. In the distance the seemingly endless miles of prairie melts away as the *majestic Rockies* rise up. Admire the imposing *Three Sisters, Fairholme* and *Rundle Ranges* en-route to our destination, the charming mountain resort town of *Banff*, a thriving four season resort of wood and stone, with activities all year round. On arrival we'll take you on an orientation drive through Banff and explore some of the surrounding area including *Hoodoo Lookout*, *Lake Minnewanka* and *Bow River Falls*, before settling into our hotel and venturing into town.

Day 8 Today's sightseeing is filled with highlights, beautiful *Moraine* and *Emerald Lakes* and the equally beautiful *Lake Louise*. BANFF - JASPER

one night Jasper

Day 9 Our journey takes us along the *Ice fields Parkway* to the *Columbia Ice Field*, a 325 sq km chunk of ice 300-1,200 feet thick! We'll take an unforgettable trip aboard the 'Snocoach' on Athabasca Glacier, recognised by 'Attractions Canada' as Canada's best natural outdoor site larger than 100 hectares! We stop at the *Glacier Skywalk*, a cliff edge walkway with the most stunning alpine and glacial vistas, before continuing on to the spectacular *Athabasca Falls*, arriving in *Jasper* late afternoon.

Day 11 Enjoy a day at leisure with time to explore this quaint little village.

two nights Whistler

Day 12 This morning we bid farewell to Silvia and Mario, our wonderful hosts at Sun Peaks, and make our way to *Whistler*. En-route we lunch at historic *Hat Creek Ranch* and experience frontier life as it existed in the early days of British Columbia. This is a popular attraction incorporating the cultures of both the First Nations and early European settlers.

Day 13 Our hotel is located in the Whistler Village Common set amongst restaurants, shops and other fine resorts nestled at the foot of the spectacular *Whistler* and *Blackcomb Mountains* of British Columbia. Our time in Whistler allows you the opportunity of an optional *Gondola ride* up *Whistler Mountain*. VANCOUVER

Day 14 Set sail in the evening from Canada Place and under the Lions Gate Bridge to begin the journey cruising the Inside Passage.

Day 15 Cruising the Inside Passage One of the most scenic cruise lanes in the world where deep draft vessels can sail close to steep mountains. Enjoy the scenery and explore the ship and its many facilities.

IUNEAU

Day 16 The capital of Alaska and known not only for gold but for its stunningly beautiful views of glaciers, mountains and crystal clear water. Numerous shore excursions are available. These include a cable car ride, an excursion to the *Mendenhall Glacier*, adventure activities and fishing trips.

SKAGWAY

Day 18 Experience epic glaciers and awesome scenery in this 'UNESCO' World Heritage Site. Breathe in crisp fresh air as you glide past icebergs looking out for carving ice, whales, porpoises and seals.

KETCHIKAN

Day 19 Located on an island, Ketchikan began life as an Indian fishing camp. Along with the gold and timber industries it soon became the 4th largest city in Alaska. Its rich native heritage includes the *world's oldest collection of totem poles*. There will be plenty of time to visit the quaint stores and wander along the boardwalks to see the *salmon* leap.

Day 20 *Cruising* Relax on deck as you pass by forests in 100 shades of green. Watch out for *black bears, mountain goats, bald eagles sea-otters, humpback* and *killer whales*.

VANCOUVER

Day 21 Early in the morning we return to Canada's 3rd largest city. With its rich ethnic mix, stunningly beautiful parks and bustling natural harbour, it's hard to believe it had its beginnings with a small sawmill and a community that surrounded it. We have a short time on land before boarding a ferry to Vancouver Island.

NEW ZEALAND - DUBAI

one night Dubai

Days 1-2 We depart New Zealand this morning bound for a big adventure that awaits, stopping overnight in Dubai to rest our bodies, helping us to arrive in Casablanca in good shape.

DUBAI - CASABLANCA - MARRAKESH

two nights Marrakesh

Day 3 Upon arrival in Casablanca we're met by our national guide and touring coach, and make our way south to Marrakesh. Immediately you're struck by the very simple way of life many Moroccan's still live today. It's not unusual to see farmers working in their fields using old ploughs pulled by animals.

Day 4 This morning we begin our sightseeing of this vibrant city, including bustling *Jemaa el-Fna Square*, sitting in the shadow of the *Minaret of Koutoubia Mosque*, where you'll find all manner of curios, artefacts and locally produced goods from the abundant stall holders, not to mention traditional medicines, snake charmers, story tellers and so much more. We'll also see the ornate *Ben Youssef Madrasa* and the *captivating Medina*, which is the Mecca for bargain hunters of genuine hand made goods.

MARRAKESH - ESSAOUIRA - CASABLANCA

two nights Casablanca

Day 5 We depart Marrakesh this morning bound for *Essaouira*. This intriguing port city sits proudly on the Atlantic Coast. Bold ramparts protect the old town, or medina as it is known in this part of the world and *18th century brass cannons* still line the walls in places. Once a 'hippy hangout' the city has changed very little over the years and retains its charm via the souks, myriad of tiny courtyards and captivating narrow pedestrian streets. We'll arrive in Casablanca late afternoon.

Day 6 Our sightseeing today includes one of the world's most impressive mosques. *Hassan II Mosque* is Morocco's largest mosque, boasting the world's tallest minaret. The mosque has a glass roofed section that can slide back to give the faithful a view of God's creation, as well as a heated floor and electric doors. At night a laser on the roof points toward Mecca. We'll stop to admire the architectural excellence of *Place Mohammed V* and also make a photo stop at the grand entrance to the *Royal Palace*. Completing the day we'll drive along the Riviera of Casablanca, *La Corniche* and we'll try to allow some time for you to have a browse at the impressive Morocco Mall. Tonight we have a treat in store!

CASABLANCA - RABAT - FES

two nights Fe

Day 7 Continuing along the North Atlantic coast, in little more than an hour we'll be in *Rabat*, Morocco's capital and home to approximately 600,000 residents. Amongst other things we'll walk the narrow character filled streets of *Kasbah des Oudaias*, a fascinating 'fortress' filled with whitewashed houses and blue parapets. We'll also see the impressive *Hassan Tower*, intended to be the largest minaret in the world, and stop briefly at another of the Royal Palaces . . . they have many! Mid afternoon we begin the drive inland to our destination today, Fes.

Day 8 Our guide will tell us more of the history of this ancient land today, proudly showing us the city highlights including the ornate *Medersa el-Attarine*. A 'Madrasa' as you'll see mentioned often in the Arab world, is the name commonly given to an educational institute, religious or secular. We'll then enter the incredible *Medina of Fes* via the grand gates of the *Fes el Bali*. The sights, smells and colours within will almost certainly awaken your senses! We'll also see the 16th century *Fort Borj Nord* and give you more free time to further explore this magnificent medina labyrinth.

FES – TANGIER one night Tangier

Day 9 After a leisurely start to the morning we head back toward the coast and our last stop in Morocco, Tangier. On arrival we'll do a city highlights tour with our guide, where amongst other things we'll enter, conditions permitting, the incredible *Caves of Hercules*.

TANGIER - ALGERICAS - GIBRALTAR - TORREMOLINOS two nights Torremolinos

Day 10 Although tinged with sadness having to leave Morocco, the next stage of our fascinating journey has just begun. After an enjoyable *high speed ferry* journey across the *Strait of Gibraltar* we head immediately to '*The Rock*' itself where we join our local guide and coach to see highlights of this legendary fortress including the *Barberry apes*, the incredible *WWII tunnels* and the *100 ton gun* amongst other things. Following this memorable tour we cross the Gibraltar runway and rejoin our long distance coach for our drive to the beautiful *Costa Del Sol*.

Day 11 Much has been said about the stunning Costa del Sol, the name itself says it all. Today is yours to spend entirely as you please, from the stunning beach at our doorstep to shopping in the upper town, or simply relaxing by the pool.

TORREMOLINOS - CORDOBA - SEVILLE

two nights Seville

Day 12 Driving amongst a varying landscape of farmlands intermingled with expansive farms of a different nature, notably solar farms, we make our way to captivating Cordoba to see the incredible *Mezquita*. There is nothing else like it in the world. An expansive *Mosque* built around a grand *Cathedral*, the two co-existing in harmony. For centuries accommodating worshippers of both religions. After some free time to explore the quaint narrow streets filled with all kinds of shops, cafés and galleries, we make our way to the architecturally significant city of Seville.

SPAIN, PORTUGAL & MOROCCO

Day 13 Our city sightseeing today includes one of the most striking buildings you're ever likely to see, the *Plaza de Espana*, constructed in 1928 for the World Expo the following year. We'll also look through the Moorish Renaissance *Royal Palace of Alcazar* and stroll through the fascinating *Santa Cruz Quarter* with its beautiful flower boxes and vibrantly decorated facades. We'll stop briefly at the imposing *Seville Cathedral* and *Tower of Giralda*, and time permitting, make a photo stop at the ultra-modern, *Metropol Parasol*, constructed of timber and affectionately known locally as the 'mushrooms of Seville'.

SEVILLE – EVORA – LISBON

hree nights Lisb

Day 14 Departing the capital of the Andalusian region today, we cross the border into Portugal, and our first stop of significance, the fascinating *standing stones of Evora*. 93 megalithic stones that are thought to be two thousand years *older than Stonehenge*. We can freely move among them, touch them and take photos. After this we continue to Portugal's capital, *Lisbon*. Our first impression as we enter the city is that this is a modern city honouring its heritage, with architecture blending respectfully between old and new.

Day 15 Today we'll see a few of the highlights, including the impressive *Vasco da Gama Bridge*. Further upstream we'll see the historic *Belem Tower*, guarding the mouth of the Tagus River, and *Jeronimos Monastery*, housing the *Tomb of Vasco da Gama*. We pass back via the symbolic *Bridge of 25 April* and *Pombal Statue*. We'll also visit the 'fisherman's district 'of *Alfama*, a labyrinth of winding streets and quaint squares. Tonight we have another treat in store, dining while being entertained at a *performance of Fado*, traditional music and dance.

Day 16 Today's a totally free day to do as you please. Our hotel's location makes it the ideal starting point for exploring Lisbon. By foot, an easy and enjoyable twenty minute walk will have you in the heart of *Rossio Square* off which you'll uncover many famous landmarks, galleries, wonderful shopping and a pedestrian only mall.

LISBON - PORTO two nights Porto

Day 17 Leaving Lisbon this morning we drive to the quaint city of *Porto*. On arrival our guide will tell us more about some of the cities highlights including the colourful and much photographed *Ribeira* district, the incredible mosaics in *Sao Bento Station*, a photo stop at *Livraria Lello* made famous through the Harry Potter stories, in addition to other famous sights. Rounding off a very interesting day, you couldn't say you'd been to Porto without visiting a Port distillery, so we've chosen one of the best!

Day 18 Porto is not a city to be rushed. There are so many things to see and do, and because we all have individual tastes and desires we felt a free day to indulge personal pleasures was appropriate.

PORTO – SALAMANCA one night Salamanca

Day 19 Departing Porto this morning we make our way deeper into the heart of Spain. Scenery is ever changing, and on this particular leg we should see a significant number of *cork trees* in various stages of harvest, and expansive groves of *olive trees*, which is not surprising, given Spain produces half the worlds' olive oil. Salamanca is home to the *third oldest University in Europe*, dating back to 1218, and there are many wonderful examples of Romanesque, Baroque, Gothic, Moorish and Renaissance architecture everywhere you look. *The Plaza Mayor (Main Square) of Salamanca* is one of the best examples in Europe, and the perfect place to dine or have a nice cool drink on a warm summer's day.

SALAMANCA – MADRID three nights Madrid

Day 20 Giving you the morning to have a final look around Salamanca, we should reach Madrid by mid afternoon. This afternoon, time permitting, we'll take you to the *Prado Museum*, one of the world's finest museums, and give you time to browse the impressive collection at your leisure. For the die-hard art lovers amongst us there'll be an opportunity to return here over the coming days, or to browse another world renowned museum, *Reina Sofia*.

Day 21 This morning our local guide will show us some of Madrid's most notable sights including the 18th century Royal Palace, the Cervantes Memorial, Cibeles Fountain, Gran Via, Puerta Del Sol and Parque de Retiror. We'll also see the beautiful Atocha Railway Station. For lunch we'll give you time to wander the Plaza Mayor at your leisure, after which you may choose to re-visit one of the aforementioned museums, stay and shop or possibly take a stroll through the nearby botanical garden.

Day 22 Today's entirely yours to do as you please. We'll be on hand if you'd like any assistance, but Madrid being the city it is, we doubt you'll be stuck for ways to spend your day.

MADRID – BARCELONA three nights Barcelona

Day 23 We bid farewell to Madrid this morning as we depart for Barcelona and an interesting day ahead with an ever changing landscape. We'll have several stops en-route to make the trip comfortable. You can sit back, relax and take in the views, knowing you're in the safe hands of our professional coach driver.

Day 24 Today we'll take in some of the greatest features of Antoni Gaudi's beloved city, such as his grotesquely beautiful **Sagrada Familia Cathedral** where we have 'skip the queue' entry. We'll also visit spectacular **Parc Guell**, the forerunner of today's modern subdivisions. Two of Gaudi's most famous inner city properties are also on our itinerary today. **Casa Mila** (known locally as La Pedrera or 'the stone quarry') and the beautiful **Casa Batllo**. We'll see the top and bottom of **La Rambla**, one of the world's most famous boulevards, where you'll have time to stroll at your leisure tomorrow, and drive past the famous **Statue of Christopher Colombus** among other things.

Day 25 Our last full day in Europe, and there's possibly no more fitting place than Barcelona in which to spend it. There's a plethora of things to do, from *drinking sangria* and *eating tapas* on La Rambla, to shopping at the boutique fashion outlets, having a personal browse through any of Gaudi's creations, or possibly a little of everything. Tonight we have a special dinner planned, to conclude our journey in the appropriate fashion.

Days 28-29 This morning we depart Dubai bound for New Zealand, arriving next day and drawing to a close our magnificent journey together, for now.



NEW ZEALAND - SINGAPORE

transit Singapore

Day 1 We depart New Zealand this morning bound for Zimbabwe with an overnight stay at Singapore's Changi Airport to assist us in arriving in the best condition possible.

SINGAPORE - JOHANNESBURG - VICTORIA FALLS

three nights Victoria Falls

Day 2 We arrive in *Zimbabwe*, and the *World Heritage Site* of *Victoria Falls*. For the next three nights we'll be staying right at the footsteps of *'Mosi Oa Tunya'*, or 'The Smoke That Thunders'. Late afternoon sit back and relax as we cruise the *Zambezi River* aboard the *Lady Livingstone*. Spot elephants and other game coming down to the riverbank to drink against the backdrop of the setting sun over sundowners and canapés, a fitting start to a great adventure.

Day 3 The Devils Cataract, Boiling Pot, Danger Point, Horseshoe and Rainbow Falls highlight a spectacular display of nature's power. Our knowledgeable guide will recount the history of the falls, from their formation and their discovery by Dr Livingstone, to present day. The lush rainforest surrounding the falls is a perfect habitat for a large number of bird species including sunbirds, fire finches, paradise flycatchers and kingfishers to name a few, as well as vervet monkey, baboons and bush buck. This afternoon why not call in at the Grand Old Lady, the Victoria Falls Hotel for a cocktail or high tea and experience the atmosphere of a bygone era.

Day 4 Our last day in Vic Falls is yours to do as you please. There are many optional trips that can be arranged from *lion encounters, helicopter flights* over the falls, *elephant safaris, horseback riding bush safaris, rhino encounters* and more. A visit to Victoria Falls isn't complete without a stop at the *souvenir* and *curios market*. Here you'll find something totally African, big or small to remind you of our wonderful journey.

VICTORIA FALLS - KASANE - OKAVANGO DELTA

three nights Okavango Delta

Day 5 This morning we transfer by road to the Zimbabwe/Botswana border crossing. At Kasane we embark on a scenic flight by light plane to the *Jewel of the Kalahari*, the *Okavango Delta*. Our lodge is located deep in the heart of the Okavango, where you will experience glamping at its best in the immense beauty and vastness of *Africa's largest inland water systems*, a unique habitat for many species of animals and birds.

Days 6-7 The Okavango's unique ecosystem allows for a diverse spectrum of wild life, including *impala*, *tsessebe*, *buffalo*, *wildebeest*, *elephant*, *zebra*, *sitatunga*, *lechwe* and *waterbuck*. *Lion*, *cheetah* and packs of *wild dogs* hunt the open grassland shadowed by *hyenas* on the look-out for an easy meal. We view the game by comfortable motorized boat, *Mokoro* (traditional dug-out canoe – optional) and guided bush walks under the supervision of expert guides and trackers.

OKAVANGO DELTA – KASANE – CHOBE NATIONAL PARK

three nights Chobe

Day 8 Today we transfer to our Safari lodge situated on the banks of the Chobe River. The lodge offers a variety of activities including morning and late afternoon game drives and *sunset river cruises* to witness the largest concentration of elephant herds on the planet.

Days 9-10 Enjoy spectacular views of *elephant* along with *giraffe, kudu* and various species of *antelope* who rely on Chobe's life giving water. Experience close-up views of *hippo, crocodile* and *monitor lizards*. See many species of birdlife including *bee catchers*, varieties of *kingfishers, herons, stalks* and *egrets*. Our early morning and evening game activities provide us with the best opportunity to observe the activities of predators such as *lion, leopard, wild dog* and more. If the rigours of life on safari are catching-up with you why not recharge your batteries and treat yourself to a sleep-in and delicious buffet breakfast. Relax in a comfortable deck chair with a good book and take in the panoramic views and activities over the Caprivi floodplain where grazing buffalo, elephant and antelope are only a glance away.

CHOBE NATIONAL PARK - VICTORIA FALLS - JOHANNESBURG

one night Johannesburg

Day 11 Following a hearty breakfast we farewell Botswana and transfer to Victoria Falls Airport. This afternoon we fly to Johannesburg where we have an overnight stop.

JOHANNESBURG - HOEDSPRUIT - KRUGER NATIONAL PARK

three nights Kruger

Day 12 This morning we fly from Johannesburg to *Hoedspruit*, gateway to *Kruger National Park*. On arrival we'll be met by our hosts and transferred by safari 4x4 vehicles to our wonderful bush lodge. Late afternoon we enjoy a *game drive*, before relaxing over dinner. *Kruger* is one of Africa's largest game parks covering an area of 19,485 square kilometres. Our lodge is a private reserve on 13,000 hectares that shares an open boundary with Kruger, allowing animals to move freely between the reserve and park. The reserve is a sanctuary for the rare and endangered *rhino* which are being decimated throughout Kruger by poaching.

Days 13-14 Over the next two days we'll enjoy *early morning and evening safaris in open top Land Rovers*. There's a diverse variety of animal and plant species in the reserve including herds of *wildebeest, zebra*, various *antelope* species, *giraffe, hippo* and *Africa's 'Big Five'*, *elephant, rhino, lion, leopard* and *buffalo*. The variety in game viewing times affords us the best opportunity to see some of Africa's greatest 'hunters' when they are generally most active.

KRUGER NATIONAL PARK - HOEDSPRUIT - CAPE TOWN

four nights Cape Town

Day 15 After our final morning game drive, our Kruger experience comes to an end. We bid farewell to our hosts and with indelible memories and photos to match, depart for Cape Town. Arriving Cape Town late afternoon, we'll be transferred to our hotel located in the city centre on the *Victoria and Albert Waterfront*. The evening is yours to relax and enjoy the vibrant surroundings of the Victoria and Alfred Waterfront.

Day 16 Today begins with an orientation tour of the city including a ride on the revolving cable car to the summit of iconic *Table Mountain* for panoramic views over the city and surrounds. We visit *Kirstenbosch National Botanical Gardens*, acclaimed as one of the great botanic gardens in the world, with over 7,000 indigenous plant species, many endangered. We'll also see the *Castle of Good Hope* built by the Dutch East Indies Company in 1652, the oldest surviving colonial building in South Africa. We see Cape Town's *City Hall* where *Nelson Mandela* made his inaugural speech to the people of South Africa upon his release from prison 12 February 1990.

Day 17 We begin the day with a scenic drive along the *Atlantic Coast* en-route to *Cape Peninsula*, and the *southernmost point* on the African continent. We pass by the *Twelve Apostles* continuing on to the *Cape of Good Hope Nature Reserve*, home to a variety of wildlife. Keep your eyes peeled for migrating *humpback whales*, *baboons*, *Cape Mountain zebra*, *rhebok*, *bontebok* and the elusive *eland*. The reserve is also one of the world's largest breeding grounds for *tortoises* and is home to an abundance of birdlife. We return to Cape Town via False Bay calling in at Simon's Town naval base to see the *penguin colony* at *Boulders Beach*.

Day 18 Today we explore South Africa's famous *wine region*, where we enjoy some beautiful wines during the course of the day. Our first stop is *Paarl*. It was here on 11 February 1990 *Nelson Mandela* was finally released from prison and to freedom. We continue on to the beautiful village of *Franschhoek*, framed by a backdrop of the majestic *Franschhoek* and *Drakenstein Mountains*. Following lunch and a wine tasting we make our way to *Stellenbosch*, *South Africa's second oldest town*, founded in 1679 and displaying a gracious blend of 18th century *Cape Dutch*, *Georgian* and *Victorian architecture*.

CAPE TOWN - JOHANNESBURG - SINGAPORE - NEW ZEALAND

transit Singapore

Days 19-21 Sadly the sun sets on our African adventure and we depart Cape Town late morning bound for New Zealand with a transit stop en-route in Singapore. We arrive back in New Zealand full of memories of time spent with new found friends, experiences beyond expectation and a greater appreciation for this incredible part of the world.







NEW ZEALAND – SINGAPORE – CHENNAI – MAHABALIPURAM *two nights Mahabalipuram*

Days 1-3 We depart New Zealand for another chapter and adventure to the Indian sub-continent. Stopping overnight en route we arrive on India's southern East Coast in *Chennai*, formerly *Madras* and the *British East India Company's* manufacturing hub. Chennai is India's 4th largest city and capital of *Tamil Nadu*. We transfer directly to *Mahabalipuram* located on the Coromandel Coast on the Bay of Bengal. This 7th century town has *UNESCO World Heritage* status and over 400 Hindu temples and monuments, some regarded as the finest in India. We won't see all 400, however rest assured we'll see a few of the finest, and you won't be disappointed!

MAHABALIPURAM - PUDUCHERRY

two nights Puducherry

Days 4-5 Puducherry's a union territory located on the Bay of Bengal where age-old heritage meets modern innovation. En-route we'll stop at the only remaining fortress in Tamil Nadu, *Gingee Fort*, regarded as the *Troy of the East* by the British and the most impregnable fort in India. Puducherry was under French rule until 1954, the remnants being the *Old French Quarter*, a popular haunt where you find a wonderful fusion of *French, Gallic* and *Indian* influences in the arts, design and of course cuisine. Wide roads, well laid out gardens, beautiful French colonial mansions, historical monuments, and for India's standards, clean and orderly. 12kms south is *Auroville*, an experimental community founded in 1968 where people from all nationalities, religions, politics and creeds live together in harmony. We also explore the bustling *Tamil Quarter*, and discover Puducherry's rich architectural heritage along the *heritage walk*.

PUDUCHERRY - KUMBAKONAM

one night Kumbakonam

Day 6 Following breakfast we depart for *Kumbakonam*, en-route we visit *Nataraja Temple* in Chidambaram, a stunning example dedicated to *Nataraja Shiva*, the lord of dance. The temple's sanctum roof is covered in plates of solid gold. To Hindus, Kumbakonam is a sacred destination where pilgrims come to worship at four large temples dedicated to Sarangapani, Kumbeswarar, Brahma and Nageswarar, as well as Navagraha or Planetary temples, dedicated to the nine planetary deities.

KUMBAKONAM - TIRUCHIRAPPALLI

one night Tiruchirappalli

Day 7 More to see in and around Kumbakonam, including a village and school visit and a local market before departing for Tiruchirappalli. On our way we'll visit *Brihadeshwara Fort, Thanjavur Palace* and time permitting, the *Rock Fort Temple* of *Thanjavur*.

TIRUCHIRAPPALLI - MADURAI

two nights Madurai

Days 8-9 A leisurely day and drive to *Madurai* today. On arrival we'll have an orientation tour and settle in to our hotel for the night. Madurai is an energetic city and an ancient one situated on the banks of the Vaigai River. Its skyline is dominated by 14 colourful gateway towers or gopurams of *Meenakshi Amman Temple*. Covered in bright carvings of Hindu gods, (not all 33 million of them), this one temple draws millions of pilgrims to the *Chithirai Festival* held in April each year. An opportunity is available to attend the colourful and famous evening ritual and prayer ceremony at the temple for those interested.

MADURAI - PERIYAR

one night Periyar

Day 10 We make our way to *Periyar*, our overnight stop en-route to Kerala. This afternoon we'll visit a *spice plantation* and learn why during the middle ages spices such as nutmeg, pepper and cinnamon weight for weight were more valuable than gold. This evening you will be introduced to *Kalaripayattu* an ancient martial art that dates back over 3,000 years. *Kung-Fu*, made popular by *Shaoline monks* from China trace its ancestry back to Kalaripayattu.

PERIYAR - KERELA

two nights houseboat

Days 11-12 The next two days are spent cruising the palm-fringed river systems and lagoons of *Kerela* in our well-appointed, air-conditioned *houseboat*. A world away from the colourful frenzy which is India, we'll experience village life as it is for the small farming and fishing communities that make Kerela their home. Our friendly crew are only too happy to share with you how to prepare the simple but delicious meals we'll partake in, created from fresh locally sourced produce.

SOUTHERN INDIA & SRI LANKA

KERELA – KOCHI

one night Kochi

Day 13 Located on the coast of the *Arabian Sea*, Kochi is the *oldest European settlement* in India. Like a magnet, Kochi has been enticing traders and explorers to its shores for over 700 years and is the only place in India where you find giant 'Cheena Vala' Chinese fishing nets, a 400 year old synagogue, an ancient mosque, Portuguese and Dutch architecture, and crumbling forts leftover from the British Raj.

Historical Kochi exudes remnants of its colonial past and is wonderfully atmospheric, with its rich blended heritage encompassing a swath of heavy aromatic fragrances. The markets, antique shops and boutiques in the old town are a wonderful and interesting distraction even for the non-shoppers among us!

KOCHI - COLOMBO (SRI LANKA)

one night Colombo

Day 14 We bid farewell to India bound for the island nation of *Sri Lanka*; a country almost identical in many aspects to India yet a country with subtle but distinct differences. *Ceylon*, as it was known up until 1972, was under British Colonial rule, however prior the arrival of the British, Sri Lanka was colonised by the Portuguese followed by the Dutch, all three leaving their imprint on Sri Lanka's cultural development.

COLOMBO - DAMBULLA

three nights Dambulla

Days 15-17 We're travelling north today through lush countryside to *Sigiriya*, an area of prehistoric importance where evidence of human habitation has been found dating back 125,000 – 500,000 years. Many of the rock shelters and caves found in the surrounding area were occupied by Buddhist Monks and puritans from as early as 3rd century BC. We'll visit the magnificent *Royal Rock Temple* at *Dambulla*, the largest and best preserved cave temple complex in Sri Lanka with rock paintings dating back to the 1st century BC. Over the next two days we'll visit the 5th century stronghold of *King Kasyapa*, *Lion Rock* where atop once stood his formidable fortress. Today we can still see the beautiful *Sigiriya Frescos* and gain commanding views from the *'Sky Palace'* for those keen to attempt the climb. We'll visit the 9th century capital *Pollonaruwa*, where the Sinhalese Buddhist civilisation reached great heights, as can be seen by the incredible structures including palaces, monuments, temples and an epic irrigation system that transformed the region into what became known as the *'Granary of the Orient'*.

DAMBULLA – KANDY two nights Kand

Days 18-19 We depart Dambulla, travelling south to the British Hill Station of Kandy. En route we'll visit a spice garden at *Matale* and learn about their therapeutic values, the development of the spice industry in Sri Lanka and Matale's role in the rebellion of 1848.

Renowned for its lush forests, soothing climate, *tea, cinnamon*, and *nutmeg plantations*. Kandy was the last *Royal Capital* of the *Sri Lankan Kings*, who's legacy remains in the 18th century Royal Botanical Gardens, the *Royal Palace* housing the *Holy Temple of the Tooth Relic*, Sri Lanka's holiest Buddhist shrine containing the *relic of Buddha's tooth*. Kandy's town centre has a wonderful atmosphere with bustling colourful markets and bazaars bundled together with shops and boutiques selling the latest fashion and brands.

KANDY – NUWARA ELIYA

one night Nuwara Eliya

Day 20 We continue our journey through the mountains to the hill town of Nuwara Eliya. En route we'll see *tea pickers*, baskets on their backs, deftly plucking the tips of the plants. We'll visit a tea plantation and factory to see the process of making one of the world's favourite drinks from start to finish and where you can purchase some of the best tea in the world.

NUWARA ELIYA – ELLA – YALA NATIONAL PARK

two nights Yala National Park

Days 21-22 Today sit back and admire *picture perfect scenery* travelling *one of the most scenic train journeys in the world*. Travelling through tea estates framed against a backdrop of lush forested mountains and plateaus we wind our way to *Ella*, where we meet our coach to continue the journey to *Yala National Park* home for the next two nights. Home to elephant, deer, fox, jackal, jungle cats, crocodile, Asian bear and one of the highest leopard densities in the world, and a plethora of bird species, six endemic to Sri Lanka.

YALA NATIONAL PARK - GALLE

two niahts Galle

Days 23-24 Today we make our way to Galle located on Sri Lanka's southern coast. En-route we'll visit a local turtle hatchery where the work done has significantly improved the survival chances of four endangered species, and famous Stilt Fisherman perched on poles out in the sea, casting their lines. Lured by spices the Portuguese were the first Europeans to colonise Sri Lanka in the 16th century, followed soon by the Dutch then British. Preceding the arrival of the Portuguese, Galle had strong trading ties with Persia and the Arabian Peninsula, India, China, Malay, Greece and even Rome. Today Galle, pronounced 'Gaar-le', exudes a bursting *scent of spices* mixed with a salty sea breeze. It has a wonderful collection of colonial buildings surrounded by a *World Heritage historic fort* built in 1663 by the Dutch. Within the walls can be found wonderful boutique shops, cafés, artisans both foreign and local. When meandering through the old town every turn yields a new surprise!

GALLE - COLOMBO

one niaht Colombo

Day 25 Sadly our journey is almost at an end. Travelling north we follow the coast to Colombo and back to where we began our Sri Lankan odyssey. Tonight we'll enjoy a farewell dinner to share memories and experiences of our fabulous journey!

COLOMBO - SINGAPORE

one night Singapore

Day 26 Late morning we depart Colombo bound for Singapore and an overnight stay.

SINGAPORE - NEW ZEALAND

Days 27-28 A full day in Singapore for some last minute shopping, sightseeing or relax around the pool. Leave Singapore early evening arriving Christchurch mid-morning tomorrow.

FRANKFURT - NUREMBURG

two nights Nuremberg

Days 6-7 On arrival in Frankfurt we'll make our way south by rail to Nuremburg. *Nuremburg* boasts one of Germany's oldest Christmas markets, *Christkindlmarkt*, where modern and mass produced goods are forbidden. Regulations specify that only authentic handcrafted wares are sold from the beautifully adorned stalls blanketed in red and white cloth. Today and tomorrow are free for you to spend your time however you wish. Noteworthy in particular are the *900 year old ramparts* that surround this historic city, the *Imperial Castle* and *Justice Palace* where the War Crimes Tribunal sat in 1946.

CHRISTMAS TIME AVALON CRUISE, AVALON IMAGERY II nine nights Avalon

Day 8 This afternoon we board our ship, *Avalon Imagery II*, our home for the next nine nights. All meals whilst on board include regional wines, beer and soft drinks with dinner and complimentary soft drinks with lunch. We have included sightseeing options everyday whilst on board and the Christmas market stalls in each of our destinations await our visit! Overnight in Nuremberg on board ship.

Day 9 There are various sightseeing options today. Choose a guided tour of *Nuremberg's medieval architecture, gilded fountain, Gothic Cathedral* and *Kaiserburg Castle* or take a guided tour to the historic *Nuremberg Rally Grounds*, used by the Third Reich. Spend free time browsing the spruce stalls of the Christmas markets of Nuremberg. Sample Bavarian favourites such as bratwurst, gingerbread, delicious mulled blueberry wine, roasted chestnuts and countless other Christkindlmarkt culinary delights. Later, enjoy live entertainment on board.

BAMBERG

Day 10 In *Bamberg* we take a walking tour of this enchanting medieval town which was declared a *UNESCO World Heritage* site in 1993. The old town hall that straddles the river is one of the main features of Bamberg. Legend has it that the bishop would not grant people the land on which to build a town hall, so they drove stakes into the river and formed an artificial island, upon which it stands today. The city's charm extends to its twisting streets with quaint houses and some more elaborate 18th century mansions. Stroll through dozens of Bamberg's nativity scenes, from miniature to life-size. Take free time to enjoy the quaint Christmas markets and warm up with traditional German dumplings, sausage, and a glass of hearty Bavarian ale. Our cruising continues along the Main River.

WÜRZBURG

Day 11 Enjoy a relaxed morning cruising before our arrival in *Würzburg*, the capital of Lower Franconia. 'The Pearl of the Romantic Road' is surrounded by sloping hills covered with vineyards. During our morning tour we'll visit major sights of interest including the expansive Residential Palace. Alternatively you could visit Kathe Wohlfahrt German Christmas Museum, which houses the most extensive collection of traditional German decorations. Or you may prefer to take an optional tour to the Bavarian town of Rothenberg, a UNESCO medieval town virtually unchanged since the 11th century.

MAIN RIVER VILLAGE

Day 12 Today join a guided tour of a picturesque Bavarian village located along the Main River. Many of the villages along this stretch of the river's original settlers were Romans who built two castles here for the protection of the *Northern Frontier* of the then *Roman Empire*. Today the feel is very much medieval and beautifully timber framed and gabled houses are abundant, due largely to legislation granting residents free construction timber from communally owned forests. Then back on-board for tonight's cookie-baking demonstration.

MAINZ, EXCURSION TO RÜDESHEIM

Day 13 On arrival to *Rüdesheim*, we take a guided tour to the incredible *Siegfried's Mechanical Musical Instrument Museum*, a one-of-a-kind experience where you can admire and play unique instruments, one of the absolute highlights of previous cruise tours. Or if you prefer, explore *Mainz* at your own leisurely pace.

SPEYER, HEIDELBERG EXCURSON

Day 14 Today for those who wish, we take a guided tour that includes the magnificent *Heidelberg Castle* and the *Great Vat*, the world's largest wine barrel. After the tour, visit the local German Christmas markets in Heidelberg, or Speyer. 

- 3. Travel 2U reserves the right to alter or change the accommodation, carriers or coaches at any time for any reason. Travel 2U reserves the right to cancel or alter the itinerary for any reason whatsoever including, but not limited to, road, weather or traffic conditions, non-performance of suppliers, industrial action, operational conditions and requirements. All additional expenses incurred as a result of any delays, cancellations or alterations will be the sole responsibility of the passenger.
- 4. A minimum number of bookings are required to operate a tour and also to ensure an enjoyable small group atmosphere. Where sufficient numbers cannot be achieved, Travel 2U reserves the right to cancel the tour.
