





NEW ZEALAND - SINGAPORE

one night Singapore

Days 1–2 We depart New Zealand on *Singapore Airlines* bound for *Singapore* and an overnight stay, en-route to our grand destination China and some of the most unforgettable experiences of your life.

SINGAPORE - BEIJING

three nights Beijing

Days 2–5 On arrival in *Beijing* we will be met by our local English speaking guide, and taken by private coach to our hotel, home for the next three nights. We travel to the foot of one of the wonders of the world, the *Great Wall*, taking the cable car to a fascinating section known as *Mutianyu*. Those fit enough may decide to walk a portion or enjoy the amazing sight from where they stand. We'll take you to a *Peking Duck* restaurant and show you Beijing's most recognisable and iconic symbols *Tiananmen Square*, the *Forbidden City, Temple of Heaven* and the *Summer Palace*. We'll also see an incredible performance of *'The Legend of Kung Fu'*.

BEIJING – XIAN

two nights Xian

Days 5–7 We bid farewell to Beijing bound for *Xian*. Walk atop Xian's *ancient defensive wall*, one of the best preserved in China, built during the *Ming Dynasty* in the 14th century. Throughout the Empire, the working day would open with a bell chime and end on a drum-beat. We'll see the two great towers, the *Bell* and the *Drum Towers* standing in the very center of Xian that perform these timekeeping functions. Witness one of the best known archaeological finds in the world, the *Terracotta Warriors*. The lifelike figurines were meticulously cast to be the personal army of *Chinese Emperor Qin Shi Huang* (c.246BC) in the afterlife. Disliked by his subjects, his tomb was constructed in total secrecy by thousands of craftsmen who cast the warriors, and were rewarded by being buried alive–to silence them forever. Celebrate a wonderful stay in Xian with a specialty *dumpling dinner* and a spectacular *Tang Dynasty Culture show*.

XIAN - CHENGDU

two nights Chengdu

Days 7–9 With a history stretching over 2,000 years the city of *Chengdu* is the vibrant capital of Southwest China's Sichuan Province. In Chengdu all roads lead to *Chairman Mao*, his huge statue standing at the northern end of *Tianfu Square* in the geographic centre of the city. No tour to China would be complete without seeing the *Giant Panda* up close, and what better place than at the *Giant Panda Breeding* and *Research facility* where we learn all about them. This evening we attend a remarkable *face changing* and *dramatic* performance, and afterwards dine-out at a local *Hot-Pot* restaurant.

CHENGDU - CHONGOING

three nights Yangtze River Cruise

Days 9–12 We depart Chengdu for *Chongqing* and *Chaotianmen Port*, to join the *Century Paragon* and the start of a four day cruise on the mighty *Yangtze River*. There's an optional excursion to *The Ghost City* in *Fengdu*, said to be the abode of devils, the famous 'Ghost City' is situated on the northern bank of the river between *Zhongxian* and *Fuling*. The origin of the town's eerie reputation can be traced back to the *Han Dynasty* (206 B.C.–220 A.D.) when two officials, Yin and Wang, became Taoist recluses here, and were immortalized. Later in the *Tang Dynasty* (618 – 907A.D) their names were combined to mean *King of the Underworld*. We'll visit the beautiful 12 story *Shibaozhai Pagoda* built in the 1800's and marvel at the scenery as the ship enters the *Three Gorges* through *Kui Gate*, an imposing mountain buttress guarding the western entrance to *Qutang Gorge*. Sandwiched between the *Wu Mountains* we enter *Wu Gorge* and embark on a small boat excursion, winding our way through a narrow gap bordered by high cliffs and mountains along the picturesque and stunningly beautiful *Shennv Stream*.

YICHANG - WULINGYUAN

two nights Wulingyuan

Day 12 Disembarking Century Paragon at *Yichang* we'll take a private excursion to the *Three Gorges Dam,* a major feat of engineering brilliance, culminating in the construction of the largest man made dam in the world. Seeing is believing! Displacing over 1 million people from their homes, and containing enough water to raise initial fears that it might cause the earth to alter rotation on its axis! At capacity the dam supplies 10% of China's entire power needs. We continue our journey to *Wulingyuan*, gateway to *Zhangjaijie National Park*, brought to prominence by the *Hollywood Blockbuster* movie *Avatar*.

Day 13 Zhangjaijie National Park, is China's first national park created in 1982 and another of China's World Heritage Sites. See towering quartz sandstone pillars, dense forests and stunning lakes, making for the most uniquely, beautiful landscapes you will see. Apart from the breathtaking scenery the park is a treasure trove for rare and once thought extinct species of plants. The **Long Xia Flower** can change colour five times a day and the **Dove Tree** with dangling handkerchief like foliage whose ancestors fossilized remains date back 2.5 million years. Monkeys, bears and leopards live in the park, as well as the giant salamander who makes its home in its streams and rivers, growing up to 1.8 metres in length and weighing up to 50kgs!

WULINGYUAN - ZHANGJAIJIE

two nights Zhangjaijie

Days 14–16 This morning the dare devils among us can take an optional excursion to walk *Zhangjaijie Glass Bridge* which is suspended 260m above the canyon floor. When opened in August 2016 it was the largest and longest glass bottom bridge in the world. This afternoon we travel to *Zhangjaijie* town from where we travel on the world's longest cable car to beautiful *Tianmen Mountain*. Atop the mountain

we'll experience amazing views, cliff-side walkways, and for the brave glass walkways. We descend via seven escalators inside the mountain to *Heaven's Gate*. From there some may choose to carry-on down via 999 steps, others will take another escalator inside the mountain. Finally we will drive back to our hotel via the most incredible road with its 99 switchbacks, and the end to an incredible day.

ZHANGZAIJIE – GUILIN

four nights Guilin

Days 16–20 We bid farewell to the *Avatar Mountains* bound for *Guilin*. The name translates to *Forest of Sweet Osmanthus* due to the scented Osmanthus Forest found in the area, and is regarded as one of *China's Pearls* owing to its natural landscapes and historic beauty. We'll *cruise the Li River* from Guilin to *Yangshuo* where you'll see incredible limestone peaks, often shrouded in cloud, adding to their mystique. *Water buffalo* march ceremoniously through the fields as farmers tend their paddies, and children and fisherman float by on bamboo rafts. With its breathtaking scenery and taste of a life far removed from the hustle and bustle of the city, the scenery along the Li River is another of China's wondrous sights to be seen. We'll also experience amazing *Longsheng Rice Terraces (Dragons Backbone)*. Construction of the terraces began during the *Yuan Dynasty*, 1271 – 1368, and completed in 1911 during the *Qing Dynasty*. They're a culmination of both insightful wisdom and the tireless labour of a local ethnic minority called the *Zhuang*. Interwoven over the hillsides the terraces paint an amazing picture whatever season they're viewed, and are an astonishing feat of human engineering. We'll visit the beautiful *Reed Flute Caves*, a magical fairyland of *stalactites* and *stalagmites*, stone pillars and fantastic shapes depicting birds, plants and various animals, highlighted by an amazing display of coloured lighting.

GUILIN - SHANGHAI

three nights Shanghai

Days 20–23 After a short flight we are back to the big cities again, and one of the fastest growing and most dynamic of them all is Shanghai. Boasting numbers and firsts, Shanghai is a bustling metropolis of shanty's, shops, skyscrapers, vehicles and of course ... people. You'll love it! This morning we're off to **the Bund**. An area on the bank of the **Huangpu River** with a very **British feel** about it, for a very good reason. In the 19th and early 20th century it beckoned British, amongst others, with the lure of its **opium trade**. Not long after it became home to banks, financial institutions and many businesses of European origin. It affords some of the best views across the river to the skyscrapers and buildings of architectural excellence that have sprouted up, long after the opium days were over. To refresh the spirit we make our way to the beautiful **Yu Gardens**, a gem of Shanghai. Built between 1559 and 1577 the gardens with their pavilions and ponds linked by ornate bridges and rock waterfall are an oasis of peace in a fast paced city. We'll visit what was once **Old Shanghai** a bustling warren of narrow alleys filled with shops, antique stores, tea and **noodle houses**, and tiny eateries serving soup, dumplings and traditional sweets. You'll see one of the most incredible **acrobatic shows** on the planet, certain to leave you spellbound. There's a full day at leisure to **shop** or explore, however for those wanting more, an optional excursion can be arranged to **Zhujiajiao**, an interesting and ancient water town built over 1700 years ago.

SHANGHAI - SINGAPORE

one night Singapore


Day 23 Tinged with sadness we bid farewell to Shanghai and China, however we have one final experience for you aboard the *Maglev high-speed train* as it travels at 430kmh, covering 30km between the city and Pudong International airport in 8 minutes flat! Check-in for our Singapore Airlines flight bound for Singapore and our overnight stay.

Day 24 The day is yours to do as you please before we depart late afternoon to Changi Airport.

SINGAPORE - NEW ZEALAND

Day 25 We arrive back in New Zealand today filled with wonderful memories of an enchanting journey.





7 - 28 JUNE 22 DAYS



We return for our eighth year to arguably one of the most captivating regions in the world with its pristine coastlines and clear azure Adriatic waters. In *Dubrovnik* walk the ancient fortified city walls for stunning views over the white limestone streets and baroque architecture as it shimmers against the blue sea. Visit the quaint seaside town of *Cavtat*, steeped in ancient history, occupied by the Greeks in 400BC and an important Roman outpost up until the 7th century. Travelling north to the vibrant city of *Split* we'll see coastal villages dotted with *terracotta* roofs and cathedral spires forming a striking contrast against the backdrop of blue waters. Browse the markets at *Trogir* and marvel at the beauty of *Plitvice Lakes*. Explore the medieval *Trakoscan Castle* fabulously furnished appropriate to the period, and feel the serenity of the fairytale setting at *Lake Bled*, a sight that defies description. We explore by miniature train one of Europe's largest caves in Postojna and stroll along seaside promenades at sunset on the beautiful *Istrian* Peninsula. Croatia, Dalmatia and Istria will surprise you for all the right reasons, leaving you wanting for more.

NEW ZEALAND - SINGAPORE - DUBROVNIK

one night Singapore

Days 1-2 Today we depart New Zealand on Singapore Airlines, the start of a wonderful journey. We make a one night stopover en-route, so we arrive in Dubrovnik feeling refreshed.

three nights Dubrovnik

Day 3 On our arrival in *Dubrovnik* we will be met by our local guide and driver and taken directly to our hotel conveniently located in one of the most charming areas of Dubrovnik known as Lapad, with the tepid Adriatic at our feet!

Day 4 Our excursion today takes us to one of the southernmost points of Croatia, *Cavtat*, an important Roman colony in its time, and the second most important seaport of the empire. Today it's a small town full of cultural and historical significance, and a fine example of the breathtaking Mediterranean beauty typical of this region.

Day 5 We begin our day exploring Dubrovnik's *old fortified town*, including walking atop the towns defensive walls. Of particular note are the *Bell Tower Clock*, the *15th century Orlando's Column*, *Sponza Palace* and the *Dominican* and *Franciscan Monastery*. The afternoon is yours to do as you please. You may like to stay a while longer in the old town and soak up the atmosphere, or perhaps return to our hotel and do some 'soaking' of a different kind in the hotels beautiful pool or the warm clear waters of the Adriatic.

DUBROVNIK - SPLIT

Day 6 Leaving the acclaimed *Pearl of the Adriatic* this morning we head north along the coastline, destined for the captivating city of *Split*. Stopping for photo opportunities en-route and lunch at the charming little town of *Makarska*, we arrive early afternoon, in plenty of time to enjoy the vibrant evening activity.

Day 7 Split was established around the remarkable palace built for the *Roman Emperor Diocletian* in his retirement. Many Roman and Gothic structures lie within the walls of the palace, including the *Temple of Jupiter* and the *Cathedral*. After a leisurely stroll viewing the highlights of Split, the afternoon is yours to do as you please. You may like to go down to the esplanade and partake in some people watching or possibly make your way up the steps at *Marjun* to a spectacular vista over the city from above.

Day 8 This morning we're off to the *medieval town of Trogir*, its rich culture a combination of Greek, Roman and Venetian influences covering a period of more than 2,300 years. The pretty town also boasts one of the best open-air markets in Croatia.

SPLIT – PLITVICE LAKES – OPATIJA

two nights Opatija

three nights Split

Day 9 Making our way north east today with a number of comfort stops en-route, our aim is to provide maximum time to enjoy the incredible natural beauty of *World Heritage listed Plitvice Lakes*, consisting of 16 lakes and numerous waterfalls connected by kilometres of paths and wooden walkways amongst breathtaking scenery. Following lunch at the lakes we continue northwest to the *Istrian town of Opatija*, one of the most colourfully painted towns you are ever likely to see. Our hotel is within easy reach of the waterfront, linked by a wonderful promenade that spans the length of the shoreline.

Day 10 A day at leisure to enjoy the many shops, cafes and bars along the waterfront, or perhaps take a refreshing swim in the warm waters of the *Kvarmer Gulf. Opatija* is the perfect place to put your feet up, relax and take it all in.

OPATIJA - PULA - ROVINJ

three nights Rovinj

Day 11 With batteries fully charged we depart Opatija today, making our way first to *Pula*, best known for its incredibly well preserved *Roman amphitheatre*, occupying a prominent position near the harbour and dating back to the 1st century. Continuing around the *Istrian Peninsula* our next stop is the charming seaside town of *Rovinj*.

Days 12-13 The following two days are yours to do as you please. Rovinj's quaint cobbled streets are lined with artist's lairs and shops containing all manner of curios. A casual wander along the streets and alleyways will inevitably lead you up to the Cathedral which punctuates this small town and offers an impressive view over the peninsular and beyond. There will also be an opportunity for a day's excursion to Venice!

CROATIA, DALMATIA & ISTRIA



OPTIONAL VENICE ADD ON

A Venice optional day trip includes return fast ferry transfers, a guided walking tour to Piazza San Marco, a gondola ride and some leisure time to shop or explore. A busy but exhilarating day!

ROVINJ - POSTOJNA - LAKE BLED

two nights Lake Bled

Day 14 We head north again today and enter *Slovenia* for the first time making a stop at the incredible *caves* at *Postojna*, Europe's biggest and one of the most spectacular caves in the world. Our tour here will include a ride in the *miniature train* 2 kms inside the caves before we continue by foot with a local guide telling us more of the fascinating history of the caves and pointing out the differing forms of stalactites and stalagmites. We continue later in the afternoon, to the very beautiful *Lake Bled*, our restful home for the next two nights. Lake Bled was formed from the recession of the Bohinj glacier. 2.1km long and up to 1.4km wide; the lake has a maximum depth of 30.6m. After the last Ice Age, the Bohinj glacier deepened the natural hollow giving shape to its present form. The basin was filled with water when the ice melted, and is punctuated by the small island toward the west side of the lake.

Day 15 We start the day with a drive up to *Castle Bled*, perched in a most imposing position high above the lake, seeming virtually impenetrable to a potential invading foe. The Castle is now home to a very informative, modern museum. After our visit take time to enjoy the unspoilt beauty of Lake Bled at your leisure. You can circumnavigate the lake by foot or bicycle, or maybe you'd prefer to be rowed out to the small island on a *pletna*, whence upon you might like to ring the bell to bestow good luck upon yourself!

LAKE BLED - LJUBLJANA - ZAGREB

three nights Zagreb

Day 16 Our journey today includes some of the most picturesque scenery of our tour to date. Leaving the fairytale like Lake Bled behind us, we proceed to *Ljubljana*, where on arrival we will see the magnificent *City Hall, Three Bridges* and other local sights. Following lunch we drive to *Zagreb*, Croatia's capital. On arrival we will make our way to the hotel where some may choose to relax, and others may want to take a short walk to some of the prominent and historic buildings in the general vicinity.

Day 17 We begin the day with a walking tour of Zagreb's historic old town. Zagreb is effectively divided into three sections. The Upper Town, houses the multitude of *museums, galleries* and the *Croatian Parliament* on cobbled streets illuminated by gas lamps. Of particular note is the magnificent *St Marks Church* and its ornate roof resplendently covered with colourful ceramic tiles. Then there's the Lower Town with its shops, restaurants, cafés, theatre and parks, and finally *new Zagreb* notable for its high rise buildings, corporate climate and not a tourist trap by any account.

Day 18 Today we take a short drive just outside of Zagreb to one of the finest examples of a restored castle at *Trakoscan*. Rooms have been lovingly restored and maintain the authenticity of the period. There's an incredible room dedicated solely to weaponry, and views from the towers to the surrounding countryside are stunning. After this we will drive on to the charming town of *Varazdin*, where we will have lunch in a local restaurant and a wander at your leisure before we make our way back to Zagreb.

ZAGREB - SINGAPORE - NEW ZEALAND

one niaht Sinaapore

Days 19-22 A last chance for shopping or sightseeing today before we transfer to the airport in the afternoon to begin our journey to New Zealand. Our return flight includes a one night stopover en-route, allowing time to simply relax, sightsee or fit in some last minute shopping.

We land in New Zealand filled with fond memories of an incredible journey together and experiences that we will treasure forever.















9 JUNE - 5 JULY 27 DAYS



Returning to one of our most popular destinations we've recaptured all the highlights that made this journey so popular previously. A comprehensive tour featuring the highlights of the great cities of *Washington*, *New York* and *Boston* with their bounty of historical sights, structures of significance and abundant nod to the arts. We'll also explore the quaint settlements predominant in the American Civil War such as Williamsburg and Harpers Ferry, retracing a route similar to the one taken by confederate soldiers marching to *Gettysburg* through the Shenandoah National Park. We'll introduce you to the Amish and Mennonite lifestyles in Lancaster, and indulge our vices at Hershey's **Chocolate World**. NEW ZEALAND - HOUSTON - WASHINGTON

Day 1 Flying directly from New Zealand to Houston, where we connect with our onward flight to Washington. Arriving in the evening we're met and transferred to our very comfortable hotel, perfectly located close to many of the capital's notable landmarks.

WASHINGTON

three nights Washington

Days 2–3 Over the next two days we'll experience the best sights of *Washington DC* including the *Lincoln Memorial, Washington Monument, the White House, Capitol Hill, Library of Congress* and entrance to the *Smithsonian Institute National Air and Space Museum*. Washington is also well known for its remarkable monuments to the many battles it has been engaged in over the years and we'll see the best of these, Including *WW II, Iwo Jima* and *Vietnam*. We'll also visit one of the worlds most recognised memorials and the USA's most hallowed ground at the *Arlington Cemetrey*, where we'll be present for the changing of the guard.

WASHINGTON - YORKTOWN - WILLIAMSBURG

two nights Williamsburg

Days 4-5 A fascinating couple of days begin with a visit to *Jamestown*, the first successful English settlement on the mainland of North America. Named for King James I of England, and intended as a prospect for gold mining offering handsome returns for its investors. Appropriately costumed residents keep the settlement alive and there's an opportunity to wander through an authentic recreation of a sailing ship typical of those used by the early settlers. We'll also visit *Yorktown*, site of the last major land battle of the American revolution, where you'll experience life in an army tent camp, hear of military tactics, see musket loading and firing, campfire cooking and typical civilian life in the 18th century. In *Colonial Williamsburg you*'ll feel as if you've stepped back in time, walking the shingle and dirt streets, having a drink in the rickety wooden floored tavern, and experiencing the gas-lamp lighting in the evening.

WILLIAMSBURG - RICHMOND - SHENANDOAH

one night Shenandoah

Day 6 A beautiful drive lies ahead as we make our way to one of the most famous parks in America, the *Shenandoah National Park*, with further historical significance in the *American Civil War*, and immortalised by singer John Denver in his hit 'Take Me Home, Country Roads' with reference to *Blue Ridge Mountains*, *Shenandoah River*. The air is clean, the scenery spectacular and keep your eyes open, for wildlife in these parts is not uncommon. En route we stop in *Richmond* for a look around the museum and *White House of Confederacy*.

SHENANDOAH – GETTYSBURG

two nights Gettysburg

Days 7–8 We begin the day with a scenic drive through the splendour of the National Park before arriving at historical *Gettysburg*. The *Battle of Gettysburg* was a crucial turning point in the American Civil War, a conflict that determined the fate of the United States and in which the largest number of casualties was inflicted. As part of our sightseeing we'll visit the *Battlefields of the famous Gettysburg Campaign* with a knowledgeable Park Ranger. We'll also visit the *National Civil War Museum*, and in the evening we dine at a very unique restaurant with a significant place in history.

GETTYSBURG - LANCASTER - PHILADELPHIA

one night Philadelphia

Day 9 Today we make our way east, stopping at some of the greatest points of interest including the iconic *Hershey Chocolate World* for a factory tour and sampling of chocolates, before continuing to *Lancaster*, where the highlight will be a visit to an *Amish Country Homestead*. We'll learn a little of their lives, without the benefit of modern technology, no electricity, running water, telephone service or appliances, and try to understand more of their beliefs, in a community that grows year by year. Lunch will be at the quirky *'Kitchen Kettle'* before we arrive at the city of brotherly love, *Philadelphia*, later in the afternoon.

PHILADELPHIA – NEW YORK

three nights New York

Day 10 Philadelphia is famous for the *Liberty Bell, Constitution Square* and *Constitution Hall*. We'll see these and more as we explore this fascinating city. We'll stop at the colourful *Reading Market*, one of the best stocked markets in the US, with possibly an example of every kind of meat, cheese, vegetable and fruit you can imagine. Lunch here is always a fine affair! We continue through the state of *Pennsylvania* through *New Jersey* to the one and only *Big Apple* ... *New York*.

EAST COAST USA & CANADA

Days 11–12 We'll spend the next two days sightseeing including some of the most visited sites in *New York City*. We begin with a relaxing ferry ride out to the incredible *Statue of Liberty*, the first symbol of a new life awaiting immigrants crossing the Atlantic. There's also free time so you can do more of the things you like to do, before we make our way to the waterfront area on the second day to join our cruise ship.

MONTREAL one night Montreal

Day 16 *Halifax* – One of the more beautiful ports we visit is at Halifax. Day 17 Sydney – The third largest city in Nova Scotia, on the east coast of Cape Breton with a revamped port area consisting of boardwalks and numerous tourist traps. Day trips to The Bird Islands to see Puffins and Bald Eagles is popular, so too a trip to the Nova Scotia Highland village, a 50 acre 'living' museum overlooking the Bras d'Or lakes.

Day 18 *Charlottetown* – The largest city on Prince Edward Island in the heart of the St Lawrence. Take a leisurely stroll through the Victorian inspired quaint streets of the *heritage district*. Jump on the Hop on Hop off bus for a fascinating city tour, or go further afield and take a panoramic tour of the coastline to see some of Prince Edward Islands most notable landmarks.

Day 19 *Cruising in the Gulf* – Days at sea are always enjoyable, even more so when you're surrounded by a beautiful and often rugged coastline. Day 21 St Lawrence River – More stunning scenery today from the comfort of our floating hotel with our onboard naturalist drawing attention to points of interest along the route. The river is almost 1,200 km in length and covers an area of approximately 1.3million sq/km!

NEW ZEALAND - SINGAPORE

one night Singapore

Day 1 We depart New Zealand bound for Sorrento, Southern Italy with a transit hotel stop in Singapore en-route.

SINGAPORE - ROME - SORRENTO

four nights Sorrento

Days 2–6 On arrival in Rome we'll be joined by our friendly Italian Guide. Making our way south to *Sorrento* we travel the road *Tiberius Caesar* travelled over 2000 years before. En-route we pay homage to the *New Zealand* and *Allied soldiers* who were killed in the *Battle of Monte Cassino* at the *Commonwealth War Cemetrey*. Following this we make our way to the beautiful *Abbey* atop the mount. In mythology the *Amalfi Coast* was regarded as the Land of Sirens where the songs of beautiful maidens lured unwitting mariners to their doom. Explore the beautiful towns of *Sorrento, Amalfi* and *Positano*, their allure drawing visitors to their shores for thousands of years with remnants of Greek, Roman, Phoenician and Moorish occupation. Immerse yourself in the flavours of the local cuisine, the culmination of family recipes passed down through generations, prepared with the freshest ingredients sourced from local producers. We'll visit a small family owned farm for lunch, where they produce beautiful meats, cheeses, vegetables, wine, olive oil and a local favourite of the region, *Limoncello*.

SORRENTO - MATERA

two nights Matera

Days 6–8 Today we cross the ankle of Italy to *Matera* in Southern Italy's *Baslicata* region, believed to be one of the oldest continuously inhabited places in Europe and the 3rd oldest in the world. Here we find ancient cave dwellings *(Sassi)* carved out of the *calcarenite* rock some dating back 9000 years. By 1950 the town had fallen into disrepair. Today's occupiers are hippies, artisans and business people with many caves having been converted into shops, galleries, restaurants and boutique hotels. The old town has featured in a number of international films, exposing Matera to a worldwide audience. *The Passion of Christ,* a Mel Gibson production, is one such movie filmed here.

MATERA - ALBEROBELLO

two nights Alberobello

Days 8–10 We leave the region of Baslicata and enter *Puglia*, a narrow strip running down the eastern coast of Italy from the ankle to the heel, our destination *Alberobello*, perhaps one of the most unusual towns you're likely to see, and a *World Heritage site*. Alberobello comprises around 1,500 *beehive* buildings or *Trulli*, that date back to the 1600,s constructed without the use of cement, using dry walls of limestone supporting a distinctive conical stone roof. Today some Trulli are still in use as housing, however many have been converted to shops, galleries, restaurants and cafes, adding to Alberobello's attraction. We visit beautiful *Ostuni*, a medieval jumble of white-washed buildings perched strategically atop a hill with commanding views over endless olive trees to the sapphire blue Adriatic in the distance. We'll also visit the coastal town of *Polgnano A Mare* whose origins date back to the 4th century. One can wander the winding streets and feast on the vistas over the Adriatic from the cliff-top viewpoints. *Polgnano* is also renowned for its gelato, still made from secret recipes handed down over generations, and the song Volare, composed by a local song writer Domenico Modugno, and brought to prominence by Dean Martin.

SOUTHERN ITALY, SICILY & MALTA

ALBEROBELLO – TAORMINA (Sicily)

three nights Taormina

Days 10–13 Crossing from the ankle to the toe of Italy we skirt the *Violet Coast* to *Reggio Calabria*, where we board a ferry and cross the *Straits of Messina* to *Sicily*, reaching fabulous *Taormina* late afternoon. Over the next few days we'll take you on guided outings including a visit to see an attractive example of a *Greco-Roman Theatre*, located in a wonderful setting overlooking Taormina, with spectacular views along the *Ionian Coast*, and on to *Mt Etna* in the distance. Soak-up the atmosphere along the waterfront and gardens as you wander at leisure. We'll visit the ancient town of *Syracuse*, birthplace of the Greek mathematician *Archimedes* where we find Greek and Roman structures at the *Neopolis* dating back over two thousand years. We'll take you to ancient quarries where most of the materials for the Neopolis were mined. Here you can test the acoustics in the *Ear of Dionysus Cavern*. We'll visit *Otigia Island* and explore the backstreets and feel the market atmosphere going-on around you.

TAORMINA - AGRIGENTO

two nights Agrigento

Days 13–15 Travelling south-west this morning we're bound for *Agrigento* founded in the 5th century BC. We visit *Piazza Armerina* where we find the excavations of *Villa Romana del Casale* a hunting lodge and villa constructed in the 3rd century AD. The excavations have unearthed magnificently preserved floor mosaics depicting hunting scenes among others, deemed to be the richest, largest and most complex of *Roman mosaics* in the world. In *Agrigento* we explore the remains of golden, amber toned *Doric Temples*, the largest and most exquisite found outside of Greece, giving the *Valley of Temples* site World Heritage status. Much of the site is awaiting excavation, still buried beneath citrus and olive plantations creating one of the most important archeological sites in Italy.

AGRIGENTO - MARSALA

two nights Marsala

Days 15–17 Our first stop this morning is the ancient fishing port of *Sciacca*. Behind the 16th century walls we find a blend of Arab, Norman and Greek cultures co-existing in what is a fascinating old town. We continue along the coast to *Porto Palo*, for centuries an important industrial centre and one-time hub of the Mediterranean tuna fishing industry. As with the previous towns visited we enjoy the local fare from the region. We'll visit the town of *Trapani* an important supply and staging port during the crusades. Above the port the hilltop fortress of *Erice*, accessible by cable-car, affords panoramic views over Trapani and along the crescent-shaped coastline to Aegadian and San Vito Capo Islands. The fortress was founded by the ancient Greeks, followed by Phoenicians, Carthaginians, Moors and Normans, their occupation evident in the differing facets of its design.

MARSALA - PALERMO

one night Palermo

Days 17–18 Mid-morning we bid farewell to Marsala and travel northeast to the Islands capital *Palermo*. Caught in the crossroads of civilisation, here you find souk-like markets standing beside with baroque churches; gothic palaces that are framed by date palms and fair blue-eyed folk with bronze, brown-eyed cousins. Palermo is Sicily's largest city, and behind the crumbling façade lie gilded ballrooms, citrus filled cloisters and vintage shops filled with fragments from a more affluent time in its history. We'll take you on a guided orientation tour of the city, for tomorrow you're free to explore Palermo at your leisure.

PALERMO - MALTA

three nights Malta

Days 18–21 This morning we transfer to Catania Airport to connect with our flight to the Island nation of Malta. First settled by the Sicilians around 5200 B.C, Malta's location has historically given it strategic importance as a naval base, lying off the coast of Sicily and North Africa. This tiny nation has been ruled by a succession of powers with the most recent prior to independence being the British. We'll explore *Valetta*, Malta's capital including the *Upper Barracca Gardens* for spectacular views over *Malta harbour*. We'll explore the Crusader's *Palace of the Masters* and the *War Museum* exhibiting relics and memorabilia from Malta's famous siege during WWII. Have lunch at the colourful coastal fishing village of *Marsaxlokk* followed by a visit to the fortified town of *Mdina*, one time capital up until medieval times. We can help you to explore the island further on your leisure day if there is something of specific interest you want to see. With our journey coming to an end what better way to celebrate our adventure than with a farewell dinner together with new found friends

MALTA - SINGAPORE

one night Singapore

Days 21–23 Early afternoon we depart Valetta for the start of our journey home. Included is a comfortable overnight stay in Singapore, where we have a little time to catch our breath before commencing our final leg home.

NEW ZEALAND - SINGAPORE - PRAGUE

transit Singapore

Days 1-2 Today we depart New Zealand bound for Prague and the start of our wonderful journey along the Danube, Main and Rhine Rivers of Europe, enjoying a short break at the Transit Hotel at Singapore Airport en route. Arriving Prague early afternoon of day two we transfer to our centrally located hotel so we're fresh to see all the wonderful sights of this great city over the following days.

PRAGUE three nights Prague

Days 3-4 *Prague*, capital of the Czech Republic, with a population of just over 1.3 million people has a timeline dating back some 1,100 years and is a hub of art and culture in central Europe. Included in our sightseeing will be a stroll across the *14th century Charles Bridge* over the river Vltava, spanning 16 arches and lined by 30 baroque statues. We'll be guided through the *Old Town Square*, a place we'll return to many times during our stay. We'll also visit *St Cyril* and *St Methodius Church* and the crypt riddled with bullet holes dating back to WWII, a poignant reminder of the Resistance's campaign to assassinate the Nazi Heydrich, the henchman of Prague.

Also during our stay we'll have a look around the *Castle District*, providing amongst other things a stunning panorama of Prague below, and located within the castle grounds we'll encounter the highly acclaimed *16th century Lobkowicz Palace* displaying many unique art works, a number of musical instruments and even some rare musical manuscripts belonging to Mozart and Beethoven. When you've seen all you wish to see there's a lovely little café and beautiful grounds in which you can wander. Our hotel is centrally located and there'll be ample time for you to do your own thing in addition to included sightseeing.

PRAGUE - BUDAPEST

three nights Budapest

Day 5 Today we bid farewell to captivating Prague as we make our way by luxury air-conditioned private coach to Budapest. The drive will take us through some picturesque countryside, past a number of quaint towns and villages, and will provide the opportunity to experience the changing landscape from the Czech Republic to Slovakia and on to Hungary.

BUDAPEST

Day 6 We begin the day with an orientation tour of the city featuring a visit to the highest point in Buda on the Danube. *Gellert Hill* was named after Bishop Gellert who was sent to convert Hungarians to Christianity in the 11th Century but met his death at the hands of Pagan leaders who rolled him down the hill in a barrel. Crossing the famous *Chain Bridge* we'll see the Parliament Buildings, *Hero Square*, the inside of the ornate *Jewish Synagogue*, and a poignant memorial to victims of the Holocaust in the form of a *weeping willow tree made entirely of stainless steel*. No trip to Budapest would be complete without a look through the bustling central *market hall*.

Day 7 Now with some degree of orientation the city under your belt, and having covered a number of highlights already, we thought you'd enjoy a full free day to spend at your leisure. Our hotel is conveniently located atop the fascinating *Fisherman's Bastion*, and within easy walk or a small taxi fare to shopping, galleries, the river and a number of other interesting places.

AVALON MAGNIFICENT EUROPE

fourteen nights

Day 8 Today we escape the city for a while with a short drive through some beautiful Hungarian countryside to the romantic village of *Godollo*. Surrounded by woods, once the venue of Royal hunts, its attractive squares and serpentine streets beckon the inquisitive. Fascinating curios such as the *Pelican Well* and *World Peace Gong* can be found here. We'll have a brief visit to the *Godollo Palace*, then we're off to the picturesque town of *Szentendre*, with its cobbled streets and quaint little shops, brightly coloured merchant houses encircling the main square, and numerous churches and galleries to satisfy the most demanding historians amongst us. We've allowed plenty of time to wander at your leisure and have some lunch before we make our way back to the city to join our magnificent ship the *Avalon Artistry II*, resting gracefully on the Danube. We will enjoy a Gala Welcome reception with the crew and fellow passengers tonight.

Day 9 Day at leisure.

BRATISLAVA

Day 10 During the night the ship slips away from Budapest and continues to *Slovakia*. We enjoy a guided morning tour of Bratislava which includes the *13th century castle* and breath-taking views overlooking three countries; Slovakia, Austria and Hungary. The afternoon is free to shop or explore on your own. An eventful day is followed by an evening filled with an enchanting musical performance on-board.

VIENNA

Day 11 We arrive after breakfast and have the opportunity to enjoy the captivating baroque elegance of romantic Vienna, once the centre of the mighty *Habsburg Empire*. Our guided sightseeing includes the lavish *Hofburg Palace*, the impressive *Vienna Opera House*, the majestic *Ringstrasse* and imposing *St Stephen's Cathedral*. This afternoon why not stroll along *Karntnerstrasse* and sample Vienna's famous pastries? Tonight there's the opportunity to experience a classical music concert as an optional excursion.

EUROPEAN RIVER CLASSIC CRUISE

DÜRNSTEIN - MELK

Day 12 Early this morning we reach the *Wachau Valley*. We stop in *Dürnstein* and marvel at the magnificent blue façade of the baroque *Stiftskirche*. Above the town you'll spot the ruins of the castle where *Richard the Lionheart* (King of England) was imprisoned in 1192. We continue on a short cruise to *Melk* where a guided tour takes us to the town's magnificent *Benedictine Abbey*, one of Europe's largest baroque monasteries. An evening of wine tasting is one of the highlights of our visit to the *Wachau Valley* and we then continue to Linz just before midnight.

LINZ - PASSAU

Day 13 After breakfast there's an opportunity to take optional excursions to *Salzburg* and the *Cesky Krumlov*, or cruise through upper Austria to *Passau* in Germany, where the rivers Inn and Ilz join the Danube. For lovers of pipe organs, visit *St Stephens Cathedral* whose organ boasts an astonishing *17,000 pipes!*

REGENSBURG - DANUBE

Day 14 This morning we arrive at *Regensburg*, one of Germany's best preserved medieval cities. A captivating city, in which you are sure to reel off many photos. Our day includes a guided tour featuring the *Town Hall* and the *Porta Pretoria* – gates to the ancient Roman fort built in 179 AD. Cross the historic *Steinerne Brucke* (Stone Bridge) and wander the streets of the *Aldstadt* with its carefully preserved houses, some dating back to the 13th century, and enjoy Regensburg at a leisurely pace.

NUREMBERG

Day 15 Today we enter the Main-Danube Canal and cruise through the beautiful Altmulh Valley. The Main-Danube Canal straddles the Franconian Alps via 16 locks, truly a fascinating feat of modern engineering. We proceed to Nuremberg, capital of Franconia. Unlike Regensburg which was spared major damage in WWII, Nuremberg fared less favourably. Fortunately much of it has been restored to its original state. Noteworthy in particular are the **900-year old ramparts** that surround this historic city, the *Imperial Castle* and the *Justice Palace* where the War Crimes Tribunal sat in 1946. After dinner tonight we have something completely different in store – it's *Famous German Beer* sampling time!

BAMBERG

Day 16 In Bamberg we take a walking tour of this enchanting medieval town which was declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1993. *The Old Town Hall* that straddles the river is one of the main features of Bamberg. Legend has it that the Bishop would not grant the people land on which to build a town hall, so they drove stakes into the river and formed an artificial island, upon which it stands today. The city's charm extends to its twisting streets with quaint houses and some more elaborate 18th century mansions. Our cruising continues along the Main River.

WÜRZBURG

Day 17 Enjoy a relaxed morning cruising before our arrival in Würzburg, the capital of Lower Franconia. 'The Pearl of the Romantic Road' is surrounded by sloping hills covered with vineyards. During our morning tour we'll visit major sights of interest including the expansive *Residential Palace*, and who knows, we may just get to sample some of those local wines at dinner tonight on the ship. There is an optional tour to *Rothenberg* this afternoon.

MAIN RIVER VILLAGE

Day 18 Miltenberg is a picturesque Bavarian village located on the Main River. The original settlers were Romans who built two castles here for the protection of the *Northern Frontier* of the (then) *Roman Empire*. Today the feel is very much medieval and the beautifully timber framed and gabled houses are abundant, due largely to legislation granting residents free construction timber from communally owned forests.

RÜDESHEIM – RHINE GORGE

Day 19 Today we arrive in the unique wine village of Rüdesheim where we tour the town and visit *Siegfried's Mechanical Musical Instrument Museum*, one of the absolute highlights of previous cruise tours. In the afternoon we travel along arguably the most beautiful and famous section of the Rhine, passing many castles and fertile fields, and also the legendary *Lorelei Rock*. Look out young sailors, lest ye too should meet your fate on the rocks upon which fair maidens beckon you with their sweet song.





COLOGNE

Day 20 This morning we arrive in Cologne. Immediately you will be awed by the city's fabled 13th century Gothic Cathedral, taking over 600 years to complete with its soaring twin spires puncturing the skyline. Boasting over 42 museums and 120 galleries you can be sure to find something of interest if historys your thing, but if shopping's more your cup of tea, take a stroll along Schildergasse, Germany's most visited shopping street.

There are two significant claims to fame in Cologne. The fragrance world owes its gratitude for the origins of 'Eau de Cologne' (water of Cologne) and Kolsch; a very well-known specialty beer which is brewed here under strictly defined guidelines. Perhaps you'll buy a little of both today.

AMSTERDAM

Day 21 Enjoying our last morning of leisurely cruising we arrive in Amsterdam to an abundance of activities and sights on offer. Admire the wonderful architecture of this vibrant city during a guided *Canal Cruise*, sailing in a glass—top boat past beautiful 16th century merchant houses and 17th century homes. You may prefer to peruse the works of the masters at the *Rijksmuseum* or the *Van Gogh*, perhaps a quick 'just looking' stroll along the *Rossebuurt* which oozes charm by day and a slightly different appeal at night. Tonight we gather on-board for a farewell dinner with our crew and fellow guests, before we disembark in the morning to continue our tour overland.

AMSTERDAM – BRUGES

three nights Bruges

Day 22 After breakfast we'll be met portside by our driver to begin our scenic drive to one of the loveliest cities in Belgium. Our hotel, home for the next three nights, is conveniently located within walking distance of all that this fine city has to offer.

Day 23 If you've seen the 2008 movie 'In Bruges' many sights will look familiar to you on our morning sightseeing today, from the Belfry Tower standing an imposing 83 metres in the historical Centre of Bruges, to the canals we'll be cruising, offering you a different perspective of this medieval city. We'll see the impressive Town Hall and give you time to browse at your leisure through the many tourist nooks in The Market. If its intrigue you seek, the Basilica of the Holy Blood, reputed to hold a phial of Christ's Blood is certain to spark the interest of 'da Vinci code' buffs. The rest of the day is yours to enjoy at your leisure.

Day 24 Our centrally located hotel acts as the perfect base for you to roam at your leisure today. There are undoubtedly places you've seen that you wish to spend more time in and today is the day to do just that. For some, the call of the many fascinating shops and boutiques will be too much to resist, while others might enjoy a combination of history, shopping museums and art galleries.



NEW ZEALAND - VANCOUVER

three nights Vancouver

Day 1 This afternoon we begin our journey of discovery into the best of Canada and Alaska. Welcome to *Vancouver!* Upon arrival we will be met and transferred to our hotel. The rest of the day is at leisure.

Day 2 Our full day tour today encompasses many of the attractions that make Vancouver such a special place, besides the natural beauty of its mountain backdrop and blue Pacific waters. Later this morning we take a ride up **Grouse Mountain** for spectacular views of Vancouver, an entertaining lumberjack show and hopefully your chance to see some **bears!** We then go on to the historic **Capilano Suspension Bridge**, one of the world's longest suspension bridges stretching 450 feet across and 230 feet above the **Capilano Canyon!** During our visit enjoy a tree-top walk through an old-growth forest.

Day 3 A free day to explore this beautiful city.

VANCOUVER - CALGARY

three nights Calgary

Day 4 Today we are transferred to Vancouver Airport for our flight to Calgary. Our hotel is located opposite the *Calgary Tower* from where we will have great views of the city.

We stop at the *Glacier Skywalk*, a cliff edge walkway with the most stunning alpine and glacial vistas, before continuing on to the spectacular *Athabasca Falls*, arriving in *Jasper* late afternoon.



Its rich native heritage includes the world's oldest collection of totem poles. There will be plenty of time to visit the quaint stores and wander along the board walks to see the *salmon* leap.

Day 19 *Cruising* – Relax on deck as you pass by forests in 100 shades of green. Watch out for *black bears, mountain goats, bald eagles sea-otters, humpback and killer whales.*

Day 20 *Vancouver* – Early in the morning we return to Canada's third largest city. With its rich ethnic mix, stunningly beautiful parks and bustling natural harbour, it's hard to believe it had its beginnings with a small sawmill and a community that surrounded it. We have a short time on land before boarding a ferry to Vancouver Island.

Day 8 St Peter Port is the Capital of Guernsey and has been a busy port as far back as Roman times. Today it's regarded as one of the prettiest ports in Europe, with Castle Cornet standing guard over the town as it has done for more than 800 years. The church is the town's centerpiece and claims to be the closest church to a pub in the British Isles! You can learn about the Islands history at the Guernsey Tapestry, wander the beautiful Candie Gardens, visit Hauteville House, home to French writer Victor Hugo, or just relax unwind and explore the boutique shops, then sit back at one of the many cafes or bars and watch the world go by.

CORK (Cobh Port) (REPUBLIC OF IRELAND)

Day 9 Our day begins with a visit to *Blarney Castle* – a romantic ruin that dates back to 1446. Explore the castle gardens, climb the steps, kiss the stone and enjoy the breathtaking view from the top. Travelling through rolling fields our scenic drive takes us to *Kinsale*, regarded as Ireland's gourmet capital, a picturesque and enchanting town just waiting to be explored. Before returning to our ship we'll see the highlights of *Cork City* and the port of *Cobh* which was the original embarkation point for the hundreds of thousands of, mostly hungry and penniless, migrants seeking a new life in the Americas and beyond.

WATERFORD

Day 10 The oldest city in Ireland, *Waterford* celebrated its 1100 anniversary in 2014. Its history dates back to Viking times and whilst the city has been extensively redeveloped, it still retains vestiges of its Viking and Norman past in the narrow streets and town walls of the *Viking Triangle*. Here you find three excellent museums telling the story of Ireland's middle ages. We also find the home of the famous *Waterford Crystal*, where at *The House of Waterford* you can see how skilled craftsmen still use ancient wooden molds to shape hand-blown molten crystal to transform into stunning works of art. If crystal doesn't make you want to sparkle, an optional ship shore excursion into the country side surely will.





IRELAND, ICELAND AND THE ISLES

DUBLIN two days in port

Day 11–12 Settled by *Vikings* in 841AD *Dublin* has been a magnet through the ages for saints, scholars, poets, playwrights and dreamers. An easy city to navigate by foot or hop-on hop-off bus with must see's that include *Trinity College*, the *Guinness Factory and Dublin Castle*. For whiskey lovers a tour to the *Jameson* or *Teeling Whiskey* distilleries can be accommodated. For the shoppers, an array of options in close proximity to the town centre awaits, with *Grafton Street*, offering everything from high-end boutique to regular *High Street* fare. *Oscar Wilde*, *George Bernard Shaw* and *William Yeats* are three of a long list of distinguished poets, playwrights and novelists, originating from Dublin and immortalized in bronze and stone across the city. In 2018 some of Dublin's statues have been given a voice, and if you've ever wondered what a famous statue might be able to tell you if it could talk. . . in Dublin you'll wonder no more! For those who enjoy gardens an optional excursion to *Powerscourt Estate* will reward you with exquisite vistas.

Days 13–14 Two days at sea to relax and enjoy the facilities and services of your floating resort. *MS Silhouette* has *15 dining options* at your disposal including *specialty restaurants* to celebrate that special occasion, or to treat yourself to a more intimate dining experience. There are *10 lounges*, bars and dance clubs for your enjoyment, a casino, fitness and spa facilities, *shopping plaza* with high-street and top-end stores including an *innovation store*. Enroll in a number of *workshops* and *classes* including wine appreciation, mixology, food and wine pairing, art, dance, language, yoga, fitness and wellbeing, technology and photography ... the options to fill your day are almost endless! In the evening check-out the onboard entertainers, and of course the ships cabaret and shows, or catch the latest movie releases at the theatre.

REYKJAVIK (ICELAND)

two days in port

Days 15–16 This morning we arrive at *Reykjavik*, Iceland's capital city, located on the south west coast of the island. Norsemen chose this location to settle in 877A.D, due to its proximity to the *hot geothermal springs*, making life tolerable during the cold winter months. Today Reykjavik still utilizes the thermal springs to heat all of the town's buildings. From Reykjavik we will explore the geothermal fields of *Haukadalur*, where geysers spout steaming water 30 metres into the air every 8 minutes. On the glacier fed *Hvita River* see the *Gulfoss* or *Golden Falls*, an iconic waterfall disappears into a 32 metre deep crevice.

AKUREYRI (ICELAND)

Day 17 Today *Akureyri* (pronounced ak-koo-rare-ee) is Iceland's second largest city with a population of around 18,000.It's nestled at the head of Iceland's longest Fjord, *Eyjafjorour* at the base of snowcapped peaks. In the summer flowering gardens belie the geographical location as it's just a stone's-throw from the *Arctic Circle*. The *Akureyri Botanical Gardens* has a wonderful collection of high latitude plants well worth visiting. You can expect quirky cafes, quality restaurants, a handful of art galleries and museums, well maintained walkways and trails. One museum *Into the Artic* would be of interest for those with a bent on polar exploration. Exhibits include old charts used by some of the first Polar explorers, the oldest dating back 300 years. Optional shore excursions include *whale watching* or a visit to *Santa's House* where it's Christmas every day of the year.

Day 18 At sea.

BELFAST (IRELAND)

Day 19 Belfast is Northern Ireland's capital and largest city. During the *heady* days of the Industrial Revolution it was the largest producer of *Irish Linen* and had the largest rope making and shipbuilding industries in the world. Since the





troubled times of the 1970's and 80's Belfast has been transformed into a new city. The city's divided into cultural quarters being the *Cathedral*, *Gaeltacht*, *Queens Quarter* and the *Titanic Quarter* where visitors can see beautifully restored Victorian architecture, indulge in retail therapy at fabulous shopping outlets or enjoy the *quintessential Irish experience* at the lively waterfront lined with modern art galleries, live music, fantastic eateries, and a lively pub scene. Follow the *Maritime Mile* waterfront trail to see the award winning *Titanic Belfast* to explore the exhibits of arguably the world's most notorious maritime disaster. An optional shore excursion to the *Giants Causeway* can be accommodated.

DAY 20 At sea.

SOUTHAMPTON

two nights Southampton

Days 21–22 Southampton is a bustling port city bursting with history, great shopping opportunities, wonderful restaurants and superb English pubs. There's a deep connection here with WWII, having been the staging area for the *D-Day* assault on the beaches of Northern France. We'll visit *Highclere Castle* location of the hit British TV series *Downton Abbey* and *Beaulieu*, boasting one of the finest stately homes and most beautiful gardens in the UK. It's also home to the *National Motor Museum*, the *Secret Army exhibition* and *World of Top Gear*. The latest edition to Beaulieu, appropriately name *Chequered History* tells the story of motor racing from the early years to today's high performance *F1 machines. Arundel Castle* built at the end of the 11th century by the Earl of Arundel is also on our list of visits. It's one of a few castles that has descended directly from 1138 to its present day owners and has been the seat of the *Dukes of Norfolk* for over 850 years.

SOUTHAMPTON – LONDON – SINGAPORE one night Singapore

Days 23–24 After a leisurely morning we'll be met by our coach and make our way to London Heathrow Airport, to begin our flights homeward, or to other points in Europe for those choosing to stay on a bit longer. We arrive in Singapore late afternoon and will be taken to our well positioned hotel where the remainder of the day and evening is at leisure.

SINGAPORE - NEW ZEALAND



NEW ZEALAND - BUENOS AIRES

three nights Buenos Aires

Day 1 We gather early afternoon at Christchurch bound for Argentina's capital Buenos Aires, the *City of Fair Winds* and known throughout the world as *Paris of the America's* for its European elegance and French flavour. A relaxing night tonight in preparation for tomorrow's activities.

BUENOS AIRES

Day 2 Buenosaireans or Porteños are expressive and passionate and can be found drinking mate and discussing controversial topics at all hours. They take pride in their country, themselves, and their rich cultural identity. The city comprises 48 districts or barrios; is the birthplace of **Tango**, and boasts it has the greatest number of bookshops per capita in the world. We'll wander **Plaza de Mayo** to see the beautiful **Casa Rosada Presidential Palace** and the **Metropolitan Cathedral** where **Pope Francis** served as Bishop of Buenos Aires. Drive along **Avenue De Julio**, the widest avenue in the world, with its iconic obelisk. We visit the affluent suburb of the **Recoleta** with its chic fashion houses, galleries and cafes. We visit the Recoleta's ornate cemetrey where Argentina's most important families are buried including **Eva Peron** and writer **Jose Hernadez** and explore the working class districts of **La Boca**, home of the La Boca Juniors football team and their favourite son **Diego Maradona**. Last but not least **San Telmo**; here you'll find the heart of the **Tango** and gain an insight into this fascinating city's history, architecture, culture, inhabitants, anecdotes and secrets!

Days 3 Today is yours to do as you please. Buenos Aries offers some amazing shopping experiences and a wonderful café and restaurant scene. Visit the *flea market* at *Plaza Francia*, however if sophistication and designer fashion is more your style the *Recoleta* and *Avenida Alvear* should be on your list of stops with an array of upmarket boutiques and stores. If you're in the mood for culture the Recoleta is home to the *Museo Nacional de Bellas Artes*, displaying amongst other world renowned artists' works by *Goya* and *Rembrandt*. This evening we have *something special* planned that we're sure will be a memorable finale to our stay in this fabulous city.

BUENOS AIRES – IGUAZU FALLS

two nights Iguazu Falls

Day 4 We depart Buenos Aires late morning for a short flight to *Iguazu Falls*, Argentina. Crossing the border we enter Brazil (Iguassu Falls), where we find our stunning hotel, located in an amazing setting inside Iguassu National Park and only metres from the falls themselves. Once settled in we'll walk the well-formed trails for our first glimpse at one of the *Seven Wonders of Nature*.

Day 5 After breakfast we embark on a *full day excursion*, including a guided walk to the upper and lower catwalks, including the viewing station out over *La del Diablo*, the *Devils Throat*. Spread in a half moon over 2.7km Iguazu is the *widest waterfall* in the world and is topped in height only by Victoria Falls in Zambia and Angel Falls in Venezuela. They are listed as a World Heritage Site, and in 2011 announced as one of the *Seven Wonders of Nature*. We'll take a ride on a *4 x 4 vehicle* through the lush tropical jungle and an *exhilarating jet boat* ride through the rapids and into the canyon to the very base of the falls. Here the waters converge at the point where Argentina and Brazil meet and there's no better way or place to truly experience the falls majestic beauty and awesome power!

IGUAZU FALLS – CUIABA – PANTANAL

three nights Patanal

Day 6 Late morning we depart Iguassu bound for the little known area that encompasses 195,000 square kilometres and borders Brazil, Paraguay and Bolivia. The *Pantanal* is a natural floodplain encompassing the *world's largest tropical wetland*. Its biodiversity rivals that of the Amazon, and is home to a diverse and concentrated mix of animal and plant species. The Pantanal has earned its title as one of the world's last great natural wonders. Unlike the Amazon where wildlife is sometimes difficult to see due to the dense vegetation, the open habitat of the Pantanal offers prime viewing opportunities, with many species now regarded as endangered regularly seen and in healthy numbers. The next two days we'll spend on forays into the Pantanal in search of the more common species and hopefully see some of the rarest endangered species in their natural environment.

Day 7 It's is not uncommon to see *capybara*, the world's largest rodent, congregating in large herds, or a bask of sunbathing *caiman* as we motor slowly past giant lily pads, some spanning as much as 1.5 metres in diametre, all the while accompanied by masses of complaining water -fowl. Try your hand at *piranha fishing*, before we set off in search of the more elusive species that inhabit the area such as *marsh deer*, *giant otter* and if we're lucky the beautiful *Hyacinth McCaw*.

DAY 8 The Pantanal has been bestowed with the title of *Jaguar watching capital of the world*, perhaps a title that should be reserved for the more remote regions where human access is less frequent. However, sightings of the largest cat in the Americas still occur on a regular basis, especially at this time of year, when water levels have receded and the big cats are seen basking in the sun on exposed riverbanks.

SOUTH AMERICA SENSACIÓN

PANTANAL - RIO DE JANEIRO

three nights Rio de Janeiro

Day 9 We bid farewell to the Pantanal, bound for South America's salsa capital, *Rio de Janeiro*, the *Cidad Marvelosa Marvelous City*. Rio's flanked by spectacular mountains, white sand beaches, verdant rainforests and the deep blue Atlantic Ocean, giving it the designation of having the most spectacular setting of any city in the world. Located on the famed *Copacabana Beach* our hotel is surrounded by shops, restaurants and lively Copacabana Beach atmosphere.

Day 10 Today we set off on a morning drive along *Copacabana, Impanema* and *Leblon Beaches,* passing *by Rodrigo de Freitas Lagoon,* site of the Olympic rowing regatta. We take the cog-wheel train to the summit of *Corcovado Mountain* from where we're treated to spectacular views over Rio from its most famous landmark *Christ the Redeemer.* Our day of sights includes a ride on the cable-car to the summit of another of Rio's iconic landmarks *Sugarloaf* for more fabulous views over Copacabana Beach and the city.

Day 11 Today is yours to do as you please. Stroll Copacabana's boardwalk to stylish *Ipanema Beach*, Rio's fashion runway, brought to prominence in 1964 with the smash hit *The Girl from Ipanema*. Perhaps a visit to *Santa Teresa* with its cobbled streets, 19th century Mansions and Bohemian Cafes. The 137 hectare *Jardin Botanical Gardens* has over 5000 species of tropical plants including a large collection of orchids, and giant water lilies found in the Amazonian section, or you might prefer to while the day away at one of the many *beachside cabanas* that line Copacabana, with a refreshing drink in hand and a selection of dishes from the tapas menu. Tomorrow we bid farewell to Rio and Brazil bound for *Peru* where another fascinating adventure awaits.

RIO DE JANEIRO – LIMA two nights Lim

Day 12 Enjoy a leisurely morning with time available to stroll along Copacabana or indulge in some last minute shopping. Mid afternoon we transfer to Rio's Galeao International Airport for our flight to Peru's capital city Lima. Arriving late evening we'll transfer to the *Miraflores* district of Lima, an upmarket area south of the city centre, located on the Pacific Coast.

Day 13 We spend the morning exploring *Plaza Mayor* the birth place of Lima, founded in 1535 and the cities centre. The beautifully restored architecture surrounding the plaza has had bestowed upon it *UNESCO World Heritage* status. Here we find the *Presidential Palace, Archbishop's Palace, Municipal Palace, Palace of the Union* and the *Cathedral of St John the Apostle* whose foundation stone was laid in 1535. The afternoon is free to wander, sightsee and shop. Tonight's dinner will be served at *Huaca Pucllana* Restaurant with its unparalleled setting within the compound of 1,500 -year old- adobe pyramid, built by the original inhabitants of Lima.

LIMA - CUZCO - SACRED VALLEY

two nights Sacred Valley

Day 14 Today we fly to the onetime capital of the Incan Empire, *Cuzco*, where we embark on an adventure of discovery into a forgotten history and an incredible civilisation. At its height the *Incan Empire* was spread across western South America from Southern Colombia and Ecuador in the north to Chile and Northern Argentina in the south. It's estimated this huge area had a population of over 10 million inhabitants, speaking 30 different languages, and governed by a total of 40,000 Inca, making this the largest and most successful empire the America's have ever seen. Cuzco is situated at an altitude of 3400 metres (11,152 feet) above sea level, which can cause some discomfort due to altitude. To remedy any possible side effects we descend immediately 2000 feet to the *Urubamba Valley (Sacred Valley of the Inca)* where we'll spend the next three nights acclimatising, making for a much more enjoyable experience.

Day 15 Fresh mountain air and high *Andean Peaks* greet us this morning. Following a hearty breakfast we set off to explore life in and around this fertile valley. See how the decedents of the Inca eke out an existence almost unchanged over hundreds of years. We also explore the formidable Incan Fortress at *Ollantaytambo* and the *colourful Indian Market* at *Pisac*. Here your bartering skills will be tested as you browse over the many souvenirs and hand crafted garments made from the wool of alpaca and llama. Sample the empanadas (pasties), they're delicious! You'll have an opportunity to try the locally brewed corn beer, and those willing guinea pig, a staple and plentiful source of protein in the Andean diet.

SACRED VALLEY – AGUAS CALIENTES

one night Aguas Calientes

Day 16 Today we travel by *Vistadome* train through the Sacred Valley, following the *Urubamba River* on its winding journey through the mountains to the small jungle town of *Aguas Calientes*. During our journey the landscape changes dramatically from arid sub-alpine vegetation and subsistence farming, to dense subtropical jungle. We'll explore the quaint town with its colourful Indian market, unique shops and a vibrant café and bar scene.

AGUAS CALIENTES - MACHU PICCHU - CUZCO

two nights Cuzco

Day 17 Early Spanish explorers searched extensively for a city of gold the local Indians talked of, but to no avail. Eventually abandoned by its inhabitants the city was buried in jungle and remained hidden for centuries until discovered in 1911. Today *Machu Picchu, The Lost City of the Incas*, is a *New Seven Wonders of the World* and regarded as South America's most spectacular archaeological site. This morning you'll see for yourself an amazing feat of architectural engineering and a slice of history preserved and captured for all time. This afternoon we take the Vistadome train back to Ollanta Station, join our coach and transfer to *Cuzco*.

Day 18 This morning we take a slow walking tour of the town to see the beautiful *Koricancha Temple* or *Sun temple* and *Plaza de Armas*, Cuzco's main square, bustling with activity, and where we'll find the colourful night market later tonight. The most dominant feature of the square is the ornate *Cathedral*, constructed in 1576. Following a delicious lunch we visit the famous *Fortress of Sacsayhuaman*, a remarkable Incan site featuring giant foundations stones, precision cut from granite. Witness other incredible feats of engineering at *Kenko*, *Puca Pucara*. Time permitting we'll stop at the Inca site of *Tambomachay* to round off the day.

CUZCO – SANTIAGO three nights Santiago **Day 19** Mid-afternoon we depart Cuzco bound for

Santiago, the capital of Chile. We arrive Santiago late
evening however tomorrow you can enjoy a restful
sleep-in and a leisurely breakfast.

Day 20 Late morning we're taking you out of the city to a valley renowned for producing some of Chile's famous grape varieties. Local wine growers believe the cooler climate found in the valley is instrumental for producing Chardonnay and Sauvignon Blanc in the white grape varieties Pinot Noir, Merlot and Syrah in the red. The majority of vines originate from cuttings brought from France to Chile by enlightened vineyard owners back in the mid-19th century. Chilean wine producers regard the ability to trace the ancestry of the grape and wine as an essential ingredient in the wine production process. Enjoy the day relaxing over lunch and sampling some famous Chilean wines.

Day 21 Founded in 1541 by the Spanish, Santiago is a bustling modern city nestled amidst the ever present snow-capped Andes Mountains. We begin the day at *Alameda Bernado O'Higgins*, Santiago's main avenue and the commercial hub of the city. We'll visit the historical *Plaza de Armas*, the cities historical centre and *Main Square*, where we find the *Metropolitan Cathedral* and other historical buildings. Included is a visit to the *Bohemian District* of *Bellavista*, before driving to the top of *San Cristobal*, the highest hill within the city for some commanding views. Tonight we'll enjoy a farewell dinner savouring local delicacies, great friendships and happy memories of a wonderful adventure.

Day 22 Today you're free to explore at your leisure. Mid-evening we'll leave the hotel for the airport and the beginning of our homeward journey.

The terms, conditions and limitation of liability under which the tour operates are detailed hereunder and the payment of the deposit or tour price represents acceptance by the purchaser of the following:

- 1. The Tour is organised by Travel 2U.
- 2. Travel 2U is not responsible for any failure on the part of our service providers such as airlines, coach operators, hotels or cruise companies.
- 3. Travel 2U reserves the right to alter or change the accommodation, carriers or coaches at any time for any reason. Travel 2U reserves the right to cancel or alter the itinerary for any reason whatsoever including, but not limited to, road, weather or traffic conditions, non-performance of suppliers, industrial action, operational conditions and requirements. All additional expenses incurred as a result of any delays, cancellations or alterations will be the sole responsibility of the passenger.
- 4. A minimum number of bookings are required to operate a tour and also to ensure an enjoyable small group atmosphere. Where sufficient numbers cannot be achieved, Travel 2U reserves the right to cancel the tour.
- Where a tour is cancelled prior to departure, accordingly to clause 4 above, a full refund will apply.
- 6. Any special passenger requirements must be notified to Travel 2U at the time of booking. No passenger will be permitted to embark or continue on the tour while their mental or physical condition, in the opinion of the representative of Travel 2U is such as to render them incapable of caring for themselves, or whereby they become objectionable to other passengers, or they become a hazard to themselves or other passengers. Travel 2U will not be responsible for expenses resulting in such persons being precluded from completing the tour for any such reason.
- Travel 2U can give no guarantee as to the exact arrival and departure times for carriers and operators used by Travel 2U in the tour. Travel 2U will not be liable for failure to make connections with any other services and/or missed tour inclusions.
- Travel 2U reserves the right to cancel any ticket or booking or to refuse to carry any passenger where Travel 2U has not received payments within the times specified for the tour.
- Travel 2U reserves the right to vary the price advertised or printed to cover any significant increase in the airfare, fuel price, exchange rate, or other tour related tariffs and costs. Passengers are reminded that this is a condition of travel.
- 10. Travel 2U shall not be liable for any loss, damage or injury occasioned to any person or property as a result of any inclusion or action undertaken during the tour whatsoever or howsoever the same may be caused whether as a result of negligence or otherwise.
- 11. Baggage is entirely at 'owners risk' during the tour. Passengers are entitled to carry one suitcase per person with the total sum of its length, width and height not exceeding 200cm and weight 23kg. Personal items such as cameras, make-up, medication etc should be carried in a purse or cabin bag. Surcharges will apply for extra/overweight baggage and there is no guarantee that they can be carried.

12. Travel Insurance:

The tour price does not include Travel Insurance but Travel 2U requires travellers to have insurance for all overseas tours to cover any unforeseen circumstances which may arise (including, but not limited to cancellation fees, loss of luggage, medical treatment on tour and early return following death of a relative). Insurance for local tours is at the discretion of the traveller.

- 13. Due to Government regulations, smoking is not permitted inside tourist coaches, aircraft and some hotels.
- 14. To ensure all passengers have the opportunity to enjoy front and window seats, a daily seat rotation may be employed.

- 15. Where a single passenger is willing to share accommodation with a fellow single passenger, Travel 2U will endeavour to find another traveller of the same gender. Travel 2U accepts no responsibility for the suitability of the passengers willing to share accommodation. If a passenger at any time during the tour considers the rooming partner to be unsuitable, Travel 2U will, subject to availability and at the additional cost of the passenger, arrange single accommodation.
- 16. Whilst Travel 2U will take all reasonable steps to provide an enjoyable tour, Travel 2U accepts no liability for any loss of enjoyment whatsoever and howsoever experienced by the passenger.
- 17. The passenger tickets in use by the airline carrier shall constitute the sole contract between the carrier and the purchaser of these tickets and/or passengers using the tickets

18. Tour Payments:

A payment schedule will be provided by Travel 2U. Failure to comply with the stipulated dates for payments, including interim payments and a final account, will result in cancellation of some or all services to the passenger and forfeiture of monies paid by the passenger to date. Costs may also have to be reassessed due to increases in factors beyond our control such as, but not limited to, exchange rates. These may not necessarily apply if a mutually acceptable agreement for late payment has been approved (in writing) by Travel 2U.

Deposits for tours may be paid by cash, cheque, Internet banking Visa or Mastercard only. Further amounts due are based on cash, cheque payment or Internet banking only. Payments made by Visa or Mastercard will incur a 2% surcharge on the amount being paid by the passenger. No other credit cards are acceptable.

19. Cancellation Fees:

Cancellations must be advised in writing up to 120 days prior to departure, the deposit will be forfeited. After this time, full cancellation fees of monies paid will apply. 20. Passport and Visas:

Travel 2U will forward all relevant visa information relating to your particular travel arrangements at the earliest possible date. The passenger must also notify Travel 2U as this condition could prohibit you from travelling with the tour as planned. Travel 2U accepts no responsibility for non-obtained visas under any circumstances. Visa fees reflected in tour costs apply to NZ passport holders. Visa fees applicable to holders of 'other' passports will incur additional costs.

21. Frequent Flyer Points:

Where they do, failure by the airline to credit points to the passenger is not the responsibility of Travel 2U nor its employees. Retrospective requests for missing points must be dealt with by the passenger to the airline concerned.

Said 'performances' are discretionary and optional and do not constitute a portion of the tour or experience itself.
